



# **Meet Our New Seminarian!**



Nicholas Deglomine is the new "seminarian" assigned to us for the next 2 years, from Southern Seminary here in Columbia. What does this mean? He is not an "intern," which is someone who is here full time in a learning capacity. A seminarian has a "field work" assignment. He or she is sent out into the field to learn what it means to serve in a parish. Nicholas will do a lot of observing as he moves to performing different duties in the church such as lay assistant, reader, communion assistant, work with confirmation and more. Nicholas has a Masters from Liberty and his undergraduate degree from Stetson University, but comes to us from Lenoir Rhyne University after one year of study there. He is somewhat new to the Lutheran church and is eager to learn and grow. Please note that Nicholas has some issues with vision and cannot drive. Uber will get him here but

it would be very nice if people of the congregation could offer him rides back to campus or to events.

# **Council Highlights**

### **Opening**

Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.

The devotion was led by Tom Henry. Minutes of the August 2018 meeting were approved.

### **Guest Presentation**

Mitzie Schafer, regional gift planner for the ELCA Foundation, presented a proposal to assist St. Andrew's Lutheran improve its ability to receive outright or estate gifts using a process called the Ministry Funding Plan. This step-by-step process includes creative brainstorming meetings with staff and council members, helping church leaders develop an official gift policy, leading members of the congregation in table-talk workshops to begin thinking about the financial future of the church, facilitating the identification of financial goals and priorities, and meeting individually with church members who request a conversation about estate planning, specifically the bequest of unrestricted gifts to the church. Mitzie noted that it is an option, but not necessary, for the church to establish an endowment fund; the creation of an investment fund for estate gifts is an option as well.

Claire Birdsong motioned that Church Council move forward with the ELCA Foundation and Mitzie Schafer to begin the Ministry Funding Plan process. The motion was approved.

A funding "wish list" will be developed with the full participation of the congregation and prioritized by Council. A brief, impromptu brainstorming session yielded myriad ideas. Next steps in the Ministry Funding Plan process include establishing small task forces to lead initial organization and policy development, planning temple talk(s), and setting dates in the fall for a congregational workshop or workshops. Deacon Sandra Holland will work with Mitzie to help Council get started.

### **Review of 2019 Ministry Plan**

Tom Henry led a review of the first draft of the 2019 Ministry Plan with Curtis Amick and Judy Venturella present to answer specific questions about the budget. With Pastor Trump and Sandra excused from the room, **Council members discussed and approved changes to the proposed staff salaries. The motion carried.** 

Council continued its review of the proposed Ministry Plan, taking one more action: A motion was presented to move the Tanzania sister synod support line item from the Social Ministry umbrella to Benevolence; the motion carried, and adjustments will be made to S.C. Synod support based on the bottom line increase in Benevolence giving.

Tom Henry requested that ministry team budgets be reduced by 5% across the board as a show of fiscal responsibility. Some Council members advocated for a total budget cut of 5%, with some ministry teams, as able, cutting more than others (for instance, avoid reducing Social Ministry funding). Tom noted that while ministry team budgets are only 10% of the total church budget, every team needs to take a good look at spending and reduce where possible. Paul reminded Council members that at the January 2018 Council retreat, the group agreed to work on a revision of the church's mission statement (not yet accomplished). He suggested that at the January 2019 retreat, Council could explore how re-imagining and articulating the church's mission can go hand-in-hand with budget planning: How do we create and meet a budget that reflects who we are as a church?

### Pastor's and Deacon's Reports

Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.

### **New Business**

- The Property Team reported that Ron Walrath and Jay Folk have volunteered to install new ceramic flooring in the two first-floor restrooms in the children's wing. The cost estimate for new ceramic tile for both restrooms is \$1,000. Council approved a motion to increase the project budget by \$1,000 using monies from the property use fund.
- The Property Team presented cost estimates (1) to replace the air conditioning in the fellowship hall kitchen (\$5,934), (2) to repair two gas leaks in the boiler (\$1,875), and (3) to repair HVAC refrigerant leaks in the sanctuary (\$550). Council approved spending the funds necessary to repair the boiler and the sanctuary HVAC, but will revisit the request to repair the kitchen air conditioning after alternatives to controlling temperature in that space are explored.
- A motion was made to approve Anthony Nicholas Deglomine (new Teaching Parish student assigned by LTSS) as
  an associate member of St. Andrew's, which helps fulfill synod requirements for entering candidacy. Council approved the motion.
- Sandra requested \$720 to subsidize registration fees for confirmands for the Faith Alive weekend retreat that will complement the annual Lutheridge campfirmation week. A motion was made to approve a \$720 overage to the campfirmation budget; Council approved.
- Potential Council nominating committee members were suggested: Tom Henry, Pastor Trump, Sybil Long, Melissa Ray (all
  agreed), and Joe Casey. Tom Henry will identify a nominating committee chairperson. Three, perhaps four, spaces on Congregational Council will be open as first terms expire for Sybil, Melissa, and Joe, who have indicated they will not run for second terms.

**Closing:** Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
