





Makusi Water Project Update

It has been challenging for Water Missions International (WMI) to determine the most efficient method for delivering clean water to our partner community of Makusi in Tanzania, a remote village in the southwest corner of Tanzania.

Initially, it was proposed that Makusi would share a system with the neighboring community of Magoye, its church, dispensary, and primary school. However, the water system in Magoye required repairs to an existing system to maximize the distribution of water from its source. A recent visit determined that repairs have not been done to specifications and that there has been misuse and overuse of the water supply in Magoye. Unfortunately, Makusi is further along in the pipeline network and has been receiving water only two or three days a week at the rate of two to three hours a day.

Therefore, WMI has decided to pursue a stand-alone water system for Makusi believing that a separate project is feasible and sustainable for its 1,035 inhabitants. The plan includes a four-mile long buried pipeline from a newly identified water source that will bring water straight to Makusi's water storage tank. Twenty-four existing public taps will be refurbished.



Makusi's safe water committee has proved to be highly organized and motivated. They will continue to collect monthly fees which will be used to support the project including the construction of the water storage tank. It goes without saying that our friends in Makusi are desperate for water. We pray that the steps taken to complete this project for our friends will soon improve their access to the clean water that was promised to them. We give thanks for the gifts that have made this project possible and the continued support for our partnership with the Makusi community.

"If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you expect to receive, what credit is that to you? Christ calls us to share with our brothers and sisters—this is the very meaning of discipleship. We often forget that Christ himself was born into poverty! There are few matters about which Christ preaches more in the Gospels than the poor. It is our duty, our honor, and our call as Christians to care for, share with, and love the poor. In doing so, we not only serve Christ, but we become Christ for others.

Last Christmas the St. Andrew's Lutheran community gave with open hearts to families in the E.E. Taylor Elementary School Backpack program. This holiday season, through our partnership with E.E. Taylor, we have an opportunity to once again "adopt" 65 children in that program and put Christmas smiles on their faces. Here's how it works:

- 1. Take a tag (or multiple tags if you wish) and look on the back of the tag for <u>the large number</u>. Each tag also contain(s) the child's name, gender, grade, clothing size, their interest(s), and one NEED per child.
- 2. Write your name next to the corresponding child's name on the sign-up sheet.
- 3. Purchase gifts based on the child's information. We ask that you include **a book or books** and one or more of the following:
 - 1. The NEED identified on the tag
 - 2. Clothing
 - 3. A toy or game related to their interest
- 4. Please limit the total gift amount to \$45.
- 5. Return your *wrapped gift with the original tag attached* and put it under the tree by **Sunday**, **December 10** so we can deliver gifts to E.E. Taylor before their winter break.

- Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.
- **Guests were introduced:** Tara Fleck, Adam Schultz and Jonathan Sanchez from LTSS (observing the meeting for a Lutheran Polity class assignment).
- The devotion was led by Paul Osmundson.
- Minutes of the September 2018 meeting were approved.
- Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.
- **Finance:** The Treasurer's report indicates that giving for September was \$2,153 **more** than actual expenses and \$1,761 **more** than budgeted expenses. Year-to-date giving through September 30, 2018, was \$11,672 **less** than actual expenses and \$27,523 **less** than budgeted expenses.
- **Property:** The Property Team has received an estimate for construction of a handicapped restroom, and renovations of the Sunday school hallway restrooms continues with the help of Jay Folk and Ron Walrath.
- Youth: The Youth Team has proposed minor redecoration of the youth room, including the purchase of new furnishings. Council approved a motion to approve the Youth Team's request to spend \$1,188 from the undesignated memorials fund to refurbish the youth room.
- Children's Ministry: This team is finalizing plans for the Oct. 28 Trunk-or-Treat event and asks for additional volunteers to staff stations/decorate their car trunks in the parking lot and hand out candy to children in the church community.

New Business

- Council approved Nathan Mullins for confirmation.
- The Nominating Committee has submitted five names for consideration by the Council and congregation for Council membership in 2019-2020: Tom Bane and Phillip Jenkins (second terms), and Georgia Godfrey, Erin Johnson and Jay Folk (first terms). Council approved a motion to accept all five nominations for presentation at the congregational meeting at 10:50 a.m. on Nov. 11, 2018.
- Council members agreed to be present in the parlor after both services on Nov. 4 to answer questions pertaining to the proposed ministry plan for 2019.
- Council approved a motion to accept and pay an invoice for \$2,030 from the building use fund for roof repair.

Unfinished Business

Sandra Holland reported that the yoga classes Council had approved for a 10-week run have been very successful and proposed that this ministry continue. Council approved a motion that the Witness and Fellowship Team sponsor an ongoing yoga ministry, with schedule and cost to be determined upon consultation with leaders and participants and with the understanding that the cost may require overspending the proposed team budget for 2019.

Review of Revised 2019 Ministry Plan

Council discussed possible revisions to the staff expenses portion of the ministry plan. A motion to accept the ministry plan approved in September for presentation to the congregation on November 11, with no additional adjustments in staff expenses, was approved. Tom Henry reported that some ministry teams have reviewed and reduced their budgets by 5 percent.

Closing: Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
