- Minutes of the October 2018 regular meeting were approved; minutes of the called meeting were approved as revised.

Pastor's and Deacon's Reports

Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.

The date for the annual Council retreat has been tentatively scheduled for January 25-26; the location will be decided at the December meeting. Possibilities include Lutheridge (\$25/person for lodging and Saturday meals) and Mari Frye's lake house.

Leadership for Faithful Innovation exercise

Pastor Trump and Dickie Hoyt led Council members in recalling the history of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church and considering how God has been present - working through the faithful people of the church despite some significant change and challenges - to bring us to this point in our life together as community. This exercise and the spirituality survey conducted within the congregation are part of the three-year Leadership for Faithful Innovation study led in a number of parishes by the S.C. Synod and Luther Seminary with Lilly Endowment funding.
