

Council Highlights

- Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.
- The devotion was led by Phillip Jenkins.
- Minutes of the November 2018 meeting were approved.
- Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.
- **Finance:** Giving for November was \$9,285 more than actual expenses and \$3,500 more than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through November 30 was \$4,317 less than actual expenses and \$24,021 less than budgeted expenses. Pastor Trump noted that this report does not reflect a payment for S.C. Synod apportionment made after the report was created.
- **Property:** On Nov. 28, 2018, Tom Henry emailed Council members and requested a vote on replacing irreparable heating unit in the choir room. The motion to approve up to \$5,020 from savings to pay for either tying the choir room into the heating unit servicing the existing office areas, or installing a mini-split system for the choir room, passed with a unanimous email vote. Tom Bane is reviewing options with Walker-White. Tom Henry reported that the annual elevator inspection failed; corrective action involves installing a fire extinguisher and posting elevator maintenance records.
- **Children's Ministry:** Joe Casey reported a successful children's trip to visit Lowman Home residents and announced plans for a December outing to the Saluda Shoals Christmas light show and more service projects after the first of the year.
- **Worship:** The church will provide brunch after the 10 a.m. Christmas day worship service. The meal is open to all but planned particularly for those members of our church and of our community who may not have other plans for the day.

New Business:

- The Congregational Council's annual overnight retreat will be Friday, Jan. 11, and Saturday, Jan. 12, at Mari Frye's lake house. Staff will plan the retreat and send out details in the coming weeks.
- Council approved a motion from the Worship Team to use \$3,300 from undesignated funds to purchase the following: 3 black cassocks and 12 white albs.
- A set of handmade pottery communion ware that will help meet the needs of those with dietary restrictions (separating bread from gluten-free wafers, and wine from grape juice in the same chalice).
- Council members re-elected Sharon Berger as Finance Secretary, Judy Venturella as Treasurer, Deborah Slice as Secretary, Tom Henry to serve as Council President, and Tom Bane as Vice President for 2019.
- Council discussed team assignments. A team volunteer sign-up board will be available in the narthex the first two Sundays
 in January. It was requested that more information about the various teams, their purposes, and activities should be communicated to members, and that information about team activities be fully reported and included in Council meeting agendas. Members agreed that it is also important to remind families that child care is available on the Sunday each month
 when many teams meet.

Unfinished Business:

- Several members of Council (Deborah Slice, Beth Mullins, Tom Henry, Paul Osmundson) expressed interest in attending the S.C. Synod's Leadership Days meeting on Thursday, Feb. 28, at Ebenezer Lutheran Church. Rostered leaders will meet from 2 to 5 p.m., and lay leaders will meet from 6 to 8 p.m. The topic is peacemaking in our churches and communities. Others interested in attending should notify Deacon Holland.
- Tom Henry and Tom Bane continue to explore ways to improve building security. The 2019 budget does not include funds for upgrading security, so Council will need to identify the appropriate source of monies for equipment and/or services.
- Jay Folk requested that Council discuss providing more funding for property maintenance, estimating that a mere two tenths of one percent of the value of the property is annually budgeted maintenance.
- Pastor Trump and Tom Henry recognized the three members of Council whose terms ended this month -- Joe Casey, Sybil Long, and Melissa Ray and thanked them for their service as lay leaders of St. Andrew's.
- Closing: Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
