



A Word from Pastor Trump

PHATIC. That was today's Word of The Day. I get one every day, and enjoy trying to learn new vocabulary. Often I don't do that well, but this week for the first time I scored 7 out of 7 on the weekly quiz. Phatic means: denoting speech used to express or create an atmosphere of shared feelings, goodwill, or sociability rather than to impart information. That word struck me because in many ways that is what is done in a faith community. Oh, certainly in Bible study, worship, confirmation and other times we seek to impart information, but facts and figures and stories are often forgotten. What is not lost is the feeling one gets of grace, welcome and goodness in a community. Learning is critical. Sharing is important. However, we are not meeting and talking in a church, and I am not preaching, in order to win an argument. We share and talk and teach and even preach to communicate God's mercy and love to all people.



Therefore, sometimes how we say things and do things can be as important or more important than what we do or say. I experienced this in our Connections Sunday School class last month. We were considering the difficult topic of refugees. This spills into a discussion of immigration, asylum and even a wall. How easy it would have been for this to fracture into an argument and to tear at the community we share. It did not. People listened. People cared. Grace is meant to be experienced. It often cannot be taught. Thank you for the ways you help others know and feel God's goodness and grace in this place, and in your daily lives.

Lenten Devotional

Once again this year we are asking the congregation to write devotions for our daily devotional booklet. This practice has proven to be one the congregation enjoys, and those who choose to write have really enjoyed being a part of the process. The Holy Spirit stirs up faith in each of us when we choose to study the Word and respond. This year, Ash Wednesday is on March 6 so the devotional passages will be due on February 15. Please consider being a part of this even if you've never participated in the past. Please let Sandra Holland know if you are willing to write a devotional and she will assign you a verse.





KARIBU: Welcome to the Water

A Story of Faith and Commitment

At the 2013 Synod Assembly in Charleston, South Carolina, St. Andrew's delegates heard the words of Tanzanian Bishop Titus Mbilo, who described the critical need for clean drinking water throughout his country. Attendees also heard about the Synod's partnership with Water Missions International (WMI) and the Southwest Diocese of the ELCA church in Tanzania. This partnership was formed to help bring safe water to remote villages in the most desperate areas. WMI's mission is to provide this gift of safe water equipment and sanitation support to developing countries.

In the fall of 2013, after much study, prayer and discussion with our Synod, the Congregation Council authorized a task force to plan a campaign to raise money through our congregation that would pay for a clean water system for a village in our sister synod in Tanzania. The project was named KARIBU, Swahili for "welcome." The Karibu Fund was established and a year-long campaign was proposed.

The cost of a clean water system was \$50,000. Members of the Council and the task force pledged nearly \$20,000 towards the campaign. After two presentations to the congregation in January 2014, the Karibu Fund campaign was approved by a called congregation meeting on January 26. A 12-month pledge period began.

On Sunday, February 8, 2015, at a celebratory worship service, a check for \$50,000 was presented to our Synod Bishop, Herman Yoos. Mission accomplished! St. Andrew's members generously answered the call to help. Thanks be to God! Now began the long, complicated effort to bring the clean water system to Makusi, the village chosen to receive it.

The process of how to deliver a clean water system is complex. The remoteness of the area, difficulties in delivering equipment and the process of training local villagers to build and maintain systems were a few of the challenges to manage before the project could be completed.

However, please look at the photos in this issue. The system is finally near completion (they hope to dedicate it on June 30). You will see the process unfold from identifying the water source, surveying the four-mile route to the village, digging trenches, laying pipe, and building the necessary structures. Most of all, you can see the commitment and the hard work that the Makusi folk have put into the project. While a few finishing touches need to be added to complete the project, the people of Makusi will soon be enjoying clean, safe water as was promised through our efforts and those of a village committed to doing their part.

We pray for the people of Makusi and the people of St. Andrew's, that we might come to know and care for one another with God's love. We pray that the success of this water project will bring relief, hope and healing to the village, and bring realization of the profound unity of the church across nations and cultures through this ministry. Amen.

From the original letter to the congregation, we revisit this passage from Revelation 22.17:

"Let everyone who is thirsty come. Let anyone who wishes take the water of life as gift."



Council Highlights

Opening

Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. The devotion was led by Susie Derrick.

Pastor's and Deacon's Reports

Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.

Finance

Giving for December was \$34,594 more than actual expenses and \$39,981 more than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through December 31 was \$30,128 more than actual expenses and \$15,879 more than budgeted expenses. A letter thanking the congregation for its faithful giving is to be mailed in the coming week. Tom Henry will thank the congregation before each of the Jan. 20 services and will note that the church gave - through social ministries - 21% of its income in 2018.

Property

The Property Team met earlier in the evening to begin setting priorities for property maintenance and enhancement projects.

Worship

The church provided brunch after the 10 a.m. Christmas day worship service. The meal was open to all but planned particularly for those members of our church and of our community who may not have other plans for the day. There was a small turnout but enough to encourage repeating the event on Christmas 2019, and hopes are that even more will gather together for meal and fellowship on Christmas morning next year.

Education

The Education Team reports that children's Sunday school classes will use lectionary-based curriculum throughout winter and spring. Mandy Glowacki has recommended to Council that the last day of the Sunday school year be June 16. The team will be working to add children's photos as artwork along the Sunday school hall.

New Business

Council and team members will gather Sunday, February 10, after the 11 a.m. worship service to discuss team building, team communication, and the duties of team chairpersons and team representatives. All team chairs, team members, and others who would like to be involved in any of the team ministries of St. Andrew's are invited to attend. A pizza lunch will be provided.

Pastor Trump reported that St. Andrew's has received a \$5,000 grant from Lutheran Family Services to help develop, staff and present Dramarama Camp this summer. The two-week camp would use drama to support reading skills development for youth in grades 6 through 8, and would be open to students from a variety of backgrounds, including but not limited to refugees sponsored by Lutheran Family Services. The total cost of the summer program would be approximately \$15,000. Staff will continue to seek funding through grants and will seek partnerships with community organizations that can provide funding and/or other resources. Pastor Trump requested the permission of Council to continue the work necessary to make this happen. A motion to support and move forward with program planning and development was approved by Council. A second motion to spend up to \$10,000 in grant awards (in addition to the \$5,000 from LFS) and, if necessary, make up the difference with existing undesignated savings was approved.

Council approved changing two monthly meeting dates. Council will meet February 21 and April 11 instead of dates previously scheduled.

Closing: Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.

Council Retreat

The St. Andrews Congregational Council held its annual retreat on January 11-12, 2019. Mari Frye hosted the council retreat at her lake house and it provided a wonderful place for the council to meet. Council members brought an entrée or dessert to share and everyone ate well. The retreat agenda included 1.) getting to know each other, 2.) team building, 3.) Bible study and singing, and 4.) goals and strategies for 2019. Many thanks to Pastor Trump, Sandra Holland and Jenny Walrath for providing the leadership. The council left the retreat energized and excited about their work in 2019.


