



Operation Inasmuch is a nation-wide movement that provides church members an opportunity to serve their neighbors. April 13 has been designated Project Inasmuch Day at St. Andrew's, although there will be service opportunities throughout the month of April.

On the 13th volunteers will serve a meal to those who are experiencing homelessness at the Resurrections Lunch on Lawn ("LOL") Saturday feeding on Gervais Street. We'll also collect and deliver care kits and other essential items to the folks who are there. The Little Lutherans and Luther League will be collecting and distributing socks and underwear. The Ensemble will take their talents to the Agape Hospice House on April 7. Beth Hutchison is coordinating a church-wide effort to collect adult bikes which will be repaired and delivered to folks who are in need of transportation through the Cola Town Bike Collective. We are ramping up our food pantry efforts in conjunction with our neighboring church, Virginia Wingard. WELCA and Lutheran Men will be coordinating Inasmuch projects. And Linda Hughes is coordinating a long-term initiative to provide space for an Ingathering site through Lutheran World Relief wherein we and other churches will make and prepare quilts and kits for needy people around the world.




God's role in daily life


Which one of the following best describes your understanding of God's relationship to your daily life?

Which statement best describes how familiar you are with the Bible?







Connections Sunday School Class



Council Highlights

- Council began at 7:00 with the acceptance of last month's minutes.
- Finance report was received. The giving for January was less than spending and budget but the deficit was not as great as January 2018.
- Pastor's and Deacon's reports were received. There was a discussion regarding the changing nature of
 "membership" in churches. People do not join churches in the same manner as in the past and often simply do not want to join but consider themselves full participants in the community.
- Deacon Holland reported on the work of Mitzi Shaffer of the ELCA Foundation and the work being done to establish a giving policy and an endowment in the church. More will be forthcoming.
- Council approved the purchase of a new structure for the banners that are put outside the church. This will allow for easier hanging and removal. The cost was \$750 with the funds to come from the remaining "sign fund" monies and Memorial Funds.
- Property reported on the work being done on the heat and AC unit, plus the completion of one of the two bathrooms on the children's wing.
- There was a discussion about the "mega team meeting" and the comments received.
- Pastor Trump reported briefly on the results of the congregational survey.
- Phillip Jenkins lead the council in devotions reflecting on the need to reach out and care for the refugee family that has just moved into the Welcome House.
- Council closed with prayer.
