



DramaRama is Back!

Years ago many of you may remember we had a summer camp for all kinds of youth and children that used drama as a learning and developmental tool. It was by all measures a great success. This summer the council has committed to having a two week Dramarama using drama as a tool to address READING with middle school students, including hopefully garnering some participants from those who came here as refugees through Lutheran Services. Pat Gagliano will be heading up the camp, and Vicky Saye Henderson and Rachel Cooper will both be instructors. Work has already begun shaping the camp.



So far we have received two grants from two Lutheran Churches totaling \$6000. A total of at least \$13,000 is needed. Pastor Trump has submitted two other grants and is presently waiting to hear back. We will ask students to pay a very nominal fee (\$55) in order to have "buy in" from the parents and youth. However no one will be turned away.

The camp will be held Monday to Friday from July 8th through July 19th with final performance presented by the youth on that Friday afternoon.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- Pray for the success of the camp.
- Identify and recruit middle school students to participate.
- Donate to the project. Maybe you would like to "sponsor a student"? If we get all the students we desire (a max of 40) the cost is about \$325 per student before the \$55.
- Volunteer to help. During those weeks we will need help with a variety of tasks, including FOOD PREPARATION, TRANSPORTATION (we might have to drive the van to one or two locations to pick up youth) AFTERNOON CHAPERONING (from 3 5 the youth will not have classes but will be able to remain with us) and more. Virginia Wingard Food Pantry

More than 90 percent of children attending schools around our church are living in poverty. Their families experience food insecurity; choosing between food and essential expenses like utilities, medical care and rent. As a result, our church frequently receives requests for food assistance. We work with the food pantry at Virginia Wingard United Methodist Church. Their volunteers pack grocery bags with 15 pre-selected items for residents of the 29201, 29203 and 29210 zip codes.

Each month, St. Andrew's Lutheran Church will be collecting nonperishable food to support this ministry. Please drop your donated food in the shopping cart in the gathering area.

This month, we'll be collecting:

- · 14 to 16 oz. jar of peanut butter
- · 20 to 24 oz. jar of jelly/jam
- · Dry cereal (box or bag)
- · 14-16 oz. can of fruit

Council Highlights

Opening

Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

The devotion was led by Jay Folk

Minutes of the February 2019 meeting were approved as submitted by Beth Mullins.

Pastor's and Deacon's Reports

Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.

Guest presentation on the New Consecration Sunday proposal

The S.C. Synod stewardship director, Rev. Ozzie Herlong, presented to Council an overview of the stewardship development strategy endorsed and supported by the S.C. Synod, New Consecration Sunday. He outlined the process and highlighted several features of the program. Ron Walrath has agreed to chair the program if it is approved.

Pr. Herlong excused himself from the meeting so that Council could discuss what had been presented. Various endorsements and concerns were discussed. Council approved a motion to table the discussion until the group could discuss the proposal in more detail with Ron Walrath at the April Council meeting. A decision could be made by Council at the April meeting.

Finance

Giving for February was \$6,049 more than actual expenses and \$664 more than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through February 28 was \$3,274 more than actual expenses and \$3,678 less than budgeted expenses. To meet our budget, we need to receive approximately \$41,400 per month in current & benevolence giving.

Property

The Property Team reported that it had met the morning of March 14 with the designer and project manager from McWaters to tour the narthex, parlor, sanctuary and gathering area to discuss renovation and redecorating ideas and concerns. McWaters will prepare a new set of computer-aided design drawings based on new ideas and obtain contractors' estimates for each update being considered. (Council did not vote on awarding the narthex painting contract as originally scheduled for new business because of design changes proposed at the McWaters meeting.)

Work continues on the downstairs bathroom renovation and new handicapped-accessible bathroom.

It was reported that wildlife of some sort has damaged electrical wiring in the Refugee House, requiring repairs and wildlife removal service, and it was noted that the fire suppression system in the Fellowship Hall kitchen is not up to date and must be brought up to code. (See New Business.)

The spring property clean-up day begins at 8 a.m. on March 30. Any and all members are encouraged to bring work supplies and help with interior and exterior maintenance tasks, including but not limited to cleaning out the garage and groundskeeping work.

Social Ministry

A month of various projects is being planned for Inasmuch in April. The committee also would like to remind members that St. Andrew's contributes to the Virginia Wingard Methodist Church's food pantry that serves the community in our church neighborhood, and committee members are thinking of ways to increase our commitment and contributions to this important ministry.

Education

Georgia Godfrey reported that curricula for VBS and 2019-20 children's Sunday school had been selected and the team is exploring options for first communication education.

New Business

Tom Henry distributed drafts of endowment fund and gift policy guidelines that had been prepared by volunteers from the congregation in preparation for the ELCA Foundation's work with St. Andrew's on planned giving. He asked Council members to carefully review the drafts and to prepare and send in questions to be answered in FAQ format by those who drafted the policies. Plans are for Council to review, approve and present final policy proposals to the congregation for approval in June. If approved, on June 23 there will be a congregational luncheon to begin a related visioning process.

Council approved a motion to spend no more than \$2,000 from the Refugee Welcome House Fund to repair electrical wiring and contract with a pest removal service to identify point(s) of entry for animals and to remove the animals from the building.

Council approved a motion to complete work necessary to bring the kitchen suppression system up to code with monies coming from the Building Use Fund. The work is estimated to be near \$2,000.

Pr. Trump reported that Patrick has returned to Columbia and is receiving support from St. Andrew's for temporary housing at a boarding house until he can be moved to Transitions for room, board, and social assistance. Pastor Trump has nearly exhausted all resources for government/non-profit assistance that he is aware of and will welcome new suggestions. Council discussed ideas, agreed to pay for lodging for Patrick for one more week (total of three).

Old Business

Pr. Trump continues to seek grant funds to support a Dramarama ministry for the coming summer months. Funds raised will pay for necessary program staff and interns. Dramarama dates are set for July 8-19, 2019.

Closing: Pr. Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
