
Youth, Mark Your Calendars! 7th - 12th grade youth







Council Highlights

Opening

- Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. The devotion was led by Claire Birdsong.
- Minutes of the April 2019 meeting were approved.
- Tom reminded Council members to lock the balcony, parlor, and workroom doors on Sundays after depositing the offering and returning the bank key.

Pastor and Deacon Reports: Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted as distributed.

Finance: Giving for April, 2019, was \$2,489 **less** than actual expenses and \$7,181 less than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through April 30 was \$2,590 **less** than actual expenses and \$13,098 less than budgeted expenses.

Property

- On April 22, 2019, Council members responded to an email from Tom Henry requesting approval to spend up to \$500 from the Welcome House Fund to replace a clothes dryer in the Welcome House. Council approved the expenditure.
- Tom Bane reported that work should begin on the handicapped-accessible restroom in August, when the current restroom renovations are completed.
- The Property Team is securing estimates for electrical repairs in the Welcome House, including a new panel box. Council approved the expenditure of funds to replace the dryer connection to accommodate the newly purchased dryer.
- Tom Henry reported that the McWaters firm is finalizing design proposals and estimates for upgrades in the narthex and sanctuary; the narthex committee will meet with representatives from McWaters to review options in the coming weeks.

Witness & Fellowship: The Witness & Fellowship Team reported a successful Easter breakfast celebration, and announced plans to organize summer game nights.

Stewardship: The Stewardship Team will work over the next few months to plan a fall stewardship focus with a specific goal of increasing electronic giving.

Education: June 16 is the last day of Sunday school for this school year; Vacation Bible School will be held July 21-25.

Worship: The Worship Team has been reviewing Easter and Lent services and their attendance, Altar Guild leadership needs, plans for summer worship, ongoing planning for updates in the narthex and sanctuary, and the purchase of new chimes for the bell choir.

Cemetery: The Cemetery Team is in ongoing discussion regarding necessary grading work and other maintenance needs.

Unfinished Business

- Tom Henry asked Council members to review the drafts of gift and endowment policies and to email him questions about the proposals at least one week before the next Council meeting (by Thursday, May 30). Council will approve final proposals before presenting them to the congregation for vote. Deacon Holland noted that discussions with the congregation about planned giving through the ELCA Foundation will be done in small groups rather than in a larger gathering of the congregation as originally planned.
- In response to a request made by Jay Folk to engage in long-term planning/visioning for the infrastructure needs of church property, Pastor Trump is exploring resources available to assist with a possible capital campaign to raise funds that will support property improvement projects and ongoing property maintenance, among other long-term needs of the church. He has received an initial proposal from a professional campaign coordinator who has led successful church capital campaigns. He noted that creating an endowment fund and conducting a capital campaign will not take place at the same time, and will address separate needs of the church and congregation. Council will continue to explore options in the coming months.
- Pastor Trump asked Council to suggest persons in the congregation to participate with him in the Leadership for Faithful Innovation
 project in conjunction with the S.C. Synod. Participants will attend three local, one-day retreats and do other work as a group, thinking "outside the box" about the future of our congregation and the church at-large. Pastor Trump will follow up with individuals suggested.
- The S.C. Arts Commission has tentatively approved a \$6,100 grant for this summer's Dramarama camp, and Pastor Trump is waiting to hear about additional grant proposals. With Arts Commission support, Dramarama will be just \$3,000 short of being fully funded through grant monies.

New Business

• Members of the Elm Abode Neighborhood Association are concerned about homeless persons they've observed using church property as a place to sleep and eat. Church staff will be in continuous conversation with our neighbors, addressing concerns as appropriate. Council discussed the possibility of working with the neighborhood association, Cooperative Ministry leaders, and leaders of nearby churches, schools, businesses, and organizations to learn more about the increase in homelessness in our area of the city. Staff and Council agreed to explore the possibility of hosting a community meeting facilitated by Cooperative Ministry or other service organization to begin a community conversation on how to be of service to those in need on our doorsteps.

Closing: Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
