

If you are reading this you are doing so a good two weeks after it was written. Some things become old news in that amount of time. As I write our DRAMARA-MA camp is going full blast. The staff is amazing and I get to help but am not needed that much. There are a lot of challenges that go with the joys. Out of the 24 youth participating there are somewhere around 9 countries of origin represented. Often we have to remind the kids to "speak English" so that everyone is included. I wish I knew Swahili but I can only say hello. These youth all came to America through the legal refugee system. Unfortunately the number of people allowed to be considered for this method of immigration into our country is at an all-time low. These kids have been through very difficult times. One instructor was getting to know one of the kids and asked about her parents only to be told that they were both dead from violence in her home country.



Even some of the children who come to us from local schools live in poverty. These kids are joys. They are involved. For these two weeks they are a part of this church community. There have been some difficult moments but the staff is dedicated to keeping them all here. They are working with them. No one is going to be thrown out, and no one is going to be told to go back to where they came from. They are a part of us.

We are a part of a faith community with many opinions and feelings about a variety of things. I am thankful that we recognize that everyone belongs. Period. If we have differences we work on them. We talk to one another. We come together. After all, if we all go back to where we came from, we eventually all go back to God, in whom we are one.




Youth, Mark Your Calendars! 7th - 12th grade youth



Please continue to keep our students at EE Taylor, and all those who are hungry, in your prayers this summer.



Council Highlights

Opening

Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Georgia Godfrey led the devotion. Council approved the minutes of the June 2019 as amended.

Pastor's and Deacon's Reports

Pastor Trump's and Deacon Holland's reports were accepted. Pastor Trump and Deacon Holland noted that St. Andrew's will partner this year with Ebenezer Lutheran Church and St. Paul's Lutheran Church to provide confirmation education for six students (two from each congregation).

Finance

Tom Henry reported that the church is meeting expenses and staying under budget. He reminded council members that teams should submit budget requests to the Finance Team as soon as possible. Giving for June 2019 was \$4,944 more than actual expenses and \$4,442 more than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through June 30 was \$1,863 more than actual expenses and \$15,866 less than budgeted expenses.

Property

Jay Folk lifted up the volunteers who are working on various property improvement projects and explained that project completions have been delayed because as volunteers have limited available work hours and because of unexpected maintenance and repair needs revealed as projects get under way. The icemaker in the kitchen and water fountain in the Sunday school wing have been replaced; progress continues with the restroom updates in the downstairs Sunday school wing; work will begin on the handicap-accessible restroom in August; pine straw mulch has been added to planting beds. Jay reported that there are two large potholes in the parking lot in critical need of repair. Council approved a motion to repair those specific areas using approximately \$960 from the Building Use Fund.

Unfinished Business

Pastor Trump reported that the narthex task force has requested proposals from two architectural firms – The Boudreaux Group and Watson Tate Savory – for the renovations and updates to the narthex, parlor, and sanctuary after determining that the scope of the project requires professional architectural guidance and management rather than merely interior design consultation. The task force will recommend the services of one of the architectural firms based on initial meetings and initial fee estimates, then the selected firm will prepare a design and cost proposal for Council and congregational approval.

The Gift Policy task force continues work on the second draft of a proposed policy document, incorporating ideas and answering questions submitted by Council members in June. When the gift policy is completed and approved by Council, the task force will begin a new draft of a proposed endowment policy.

St. Andrew's members representing the congregation in the Leadership for Faithful Innovation program for the coming year are Claire Birdsong, Beth Mullins, Susie Derrick, Joe Casey, Chris Watson, and Paul Osmundson. Pastor Trump reported that Dramarama has been a very positive, rewarding experience for the children participating and for camp staff, noting that Dramarama welcomed children from more than a dozen countries and demonstrated that all are welcomed at St. Andrew's.

New Business

Our church sexton, Debbie Grabbatin, has announced her retirement after 30 years of service to St. Andrew's. The Property Team is seeking candidates to fill that position, and will be working on an official written job description based on the myriad tasks Debbie has assumed responsibility for over the years. The sexton is not an official member of staff but rather an independent contractor arranged through the Property Team. To honor Debbie and her service to the congregation Council will host a reception for Debbie on Sunday, Aug. 4, after the 11 a.m. worship service.

Closing: Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
