**Tell all:** Everyone has a place at the table at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church!




## **A Word from Pastor Trump**



## **Weekend Food Backpacks for** E. E. Taylor Elementary School

School has started and that means the Backpack Program is back in action! There are going to be some changes this year due to how Harvest Hope is packaging the food delivered to us. We are honestly not sure what this is going to look like yet, but our first delivery is the first week of September and we'll have a better idea of what we're getting from them and what's needed from you, our faithful congregation, after this first delivery.

Right now, we are going to start funding the backpacks and the numbers will remain the same: \$7.50/child/week or \$250/child/year. Checks (please write "Backpack Program" in the memo line), cash, or a pledge to be carried out during the school year, are all ways you can financially support this ministry. We will also continue to need drivers to deliver food to the school each Friday of

the month. Beyond that, I will keep you updated after we receive our first delivery next month.


## **Music Ministry News**

# New Altar Furnishing and Means of Distribution



Part of our custom at the table is that we all drink from the same cup. However, we also want to offer an alternative to wine for those who require it. If we can do this without calling attention to the individual, that is even better. Beginning on September 1, we will transition to a "split chalice" (the communion cup). The new chalices have a divider that separates them into one large section and one smaller section. The larger section will hold the wine, while the smaller will hold the grape juice. Those who need grape juice will dip their bread into the smaller portion of the chalice.

These beautiful clay chalices, as well as the clay paten (the plate that holds the bread) and flagon (the pitcher that holds the wine before it is poured) were made especially

for us, and were surprisingly inexpensive and beautiful.



## **Council Highlights**

#### **Opening**

Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

Tom Henry led the devotion.

Council approved the minutes of the July 2019 meeting.

#### **Presentation of Fire Safety System Study**

SALC member Brian Haley, who works with the Irmo Fire Department, presented options to Council for the upgrade of fire alert and suppression systems on church properties. He has begun assessing risks and making recommendations to increase fire protection in phases instead of installing one campus-wide system at one time, saving a large upfront expenditure but reportedly ensuring reliable monitoring, alert and response. Brian will attend the next Property Team meeting and has offered to prepare a fire emergency plan for the church.

#### The Pastor's and Deacon's Reports

Pastor Trump's report was accepted as presented. Dramarama was lifted up as a very successful summer event that he hopes can be repeated next year if funded.

Deacon Holland's report was accepted as presented with several things highlighted:

- The ELCA Churchwide Assembly was held the first week of August. Representatives of synods and churches across the nation approved many resolutions and actions, including re-electing Elizabeth Eaton as presiding bishop of the ELCA; approving a social statement on Faith, Sexism and Justice; declaring the ELCA as a sanctuary church body; approving a resolution to establish June 17 as Emanuel 9 Feast Day of Repentence; approving the amendment of the ELCA constitution to provide for the ordination of Ministers of Word and Service, plus many other actions. Council members asked how members of our congregation can learn more about and discuss the issues addressed at the assembly. It was suggested that Council select several issues to discuss during the Sunday School hour after the new church school year has begun. Pastor Trump asked members to send him recommendation for topics.
- On Sept. 8, team chairs and council representatives will gather after team meetings to discuss the synod's Leadership and Faithful Innovation project.
- Deacon Holland asked for funding to purchase t-shirts promoting the theme "For Everyone Born, a Place at the Table" to sell to members. (This is the sermon series theme for September.) A motion to approve allocating up funds from the Witness and Fellowship budget to pre-order t-shirts was approved.

#### Finance

Giving for July 2019 was \$1,800 **less** than actual expenses and \$1,620 **more** than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through July 31 was \$63 **more** than actual expenses and \$14,246 **less** than budgeted expenses.

#### Witness and Fellowship

The Cattail Shelter at Saluda Shoals Park has been reserved for the annual fall outdoor worship service and picnic on Sunday, Sept. 22.

#### Education

Georgia Godfrey reported that Mandy Glowacki is recruiting teachers for the August 25 start of the new Sunday school year. Deacon Holland added that volunteers are needed to staff the nursery during the Sunday school hour as Pat DuBose and Anita Murphy have stepped down as nursery school teachers after many years of service.

#### **Unfinished Business**

Council approved a motion to approve the revised SALC Gift Policy as presented. Council will next review the revised endowment policy document, and once approved, both policies will be presented to the congregation for approval.

#### **New Business**

Council considered Director of Music Ministries Jenny Walrath's proposal to improve temperature regulation of the pipe organ by replacing cloth screening in front of the swell pipes with a different material. Council would like to learn more about the aesthetics of proposed replacement material and will wait for more information before approving funding.

- Lutheran Men has requested funding assistance for the annual Lutheran Men/Congregational Christmas Dinner. A motion was approved to subsidize dinner catering costs.
- Tom Bane reported that repairing the AC unit on the second floor of the education wing is cost-prohibitive at this point, but requested funds to pay Walker White Inc. to perform minor repairs to the first-floor 20-ton unit. Council agreed to proceed with these repairs.
- Pastor Trump reported on the narthex task force's meetings with two architectural firms the Boudreaux Group and Watson Tate Savory. (Attending the meetings with architects were Pastor Trump, Tom Bane, Phillip Jenkins, and Deborah Slice.) After considering the two firms' presentations, interest in the project, and anticipated fees, the task force recommended that Council contract with the Boudreaux Group for the design of upgrades to the narthex and parlor, as well as the selection of new flooring for the sanctuary. A motion to pay initial architectural fees to the Boudreaux Group was enthusiastically approved by Council.

Closing: Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.

The next meeting will be Thursday, September 12, at 7 p.m.
