

### **A Word from Pastor Trump**

I'm performing some weddings this fall. One was at Lutheridge, and the other will be at Pawley's Island. The couples are not members, but the children of old friends. So, I have to come up with something to say. This gets me thinking about relationships and families. The church is at times referred to as a family and indeed we are in relationship with one another and with God. We are joined by the love of God. I read a book not long ago called A MAN CALLED OVE. It's a delightful book about a bit of a cantankerous man named Ove who marries Sonja, the woman of his dreams. She is tragically paralyzed in a bus accident early in their relationship. They journey on. He cares for her in every way imaginable. Their love simply grows. At one point the book reads:



"It is difficult to admit that one is wrong. Particularly when one has been wrong for a very long time. Sonja used to say that Ove had only admitted he was wrong on one occasion in all the years they had been married, and that was after he'd agreed with her about something that later turned out to be incorrect. Loving someone is like moving into a house" Sonja used to say. "At first you fall in love with all the new things, amazed every morning that all this belongs to you, as if fearing that someone would suddenly come rushing in through the door to explain that a terrible mistake had been made, you weren't actually supposed to live in a wonderful place like this. Then over the years the walls become weathered, the wood splinters here and there, and you start to love that house not so much because of all its perfection, but rather for its imperfections. You get to know all the nooks and crannies. How to avoid getting the key caught in the lock when it's cold outside. Which of the floorboards flex slightly when one steps on them or exactly how to open the wardrobe doors without them creaking. These are the little secrets that make it your home."

There are imperfections in our church home. There are creaks and cracks, things that stick and things that wobble. How do we learn to love those things in this community and in each other? It's what God does for us after all. How do we admit to one another when we are wrong and receive forgiveness? These are the things, the imperfections, that make this place so doggone beautiful. Thank you, for everything you have gotten wrong over the years, for the mistakes, for the blunders, and for still being faithful. And thank you for accepting me, with mine!








## **Luther League - Mark Your Calendars!**

## **New Altar Furnishing and Means of Distribution**



Part of our custom at the table is that we all drink from the same cup. However, we also want to offer an alternative to wine for those who require it. If we can do this without calling attention to the individual, that is even better. We are transitioning to a "split chalice" (the communion cup). The new chalices have a divider that separates them into one large section and one smaller section. The larger section holds the wine, while the smaller holds the grape juice. Those who need grape juice will dip their bread into the smaller portion of the chalice.

These beautiful clay chalices, as well as the clay paten (the plate that holds the bread) and flagon (the pitcher that holds the wine before it is poured) were made especially for us, and were surprisingly inexpensive and beautiful.

### Welcome Christine Vincent, Youth Associate

The Youth Team is excited to announce that Christine Vincent, whom you've met as our assigned Seminarian, has accepted a part-time, paid position as Youth Associate. We made this decision through what is believed to be clear guidance from the Holy Spirit (yes, we are Lutherans and we said that out loud!). We presented to Mutual Ministry and Council and they agreed that she will be a wonderful asset in building the faith of our middle and high schoolers. Here are some of the questions asked by Council:



### Why Christine?

During her initial conversation with Pastor Trump and Deacon Holland, Christine enthusiastically spoke of her experiences with leading youth as an intern at her home church during her senior year of college, majoring in religious studies, and as a counselor at Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp in Colorado. It was evident that she has a gift and a love for working with teens!

### How is this different than her assigned "field education" duties?

Christine has first come to us as a Seminarian in a field placement. She is at St. Andrew's to learn about church administration, increase her liturgical knowledge, and see what is involved in creating and maintaining church programs. Outside of these assignments, she'll be paid to work around 5 hours per week on youth-specific activities, which will include organizing and leading Bible studies, planning service (and fun) opportunities, and teaching Sunday School.

#### How does this affect Deacon Holland?

Deacon Holland will supervise Christine and be responsible for what happens with the youth program. However, when we called Deacon Holland to serve our congregation, it was not intended that her job would be mostly youth-related forever. As it happened, though, her primary focus for nearly 10 years has been the youth program. We'll now have a greater benefit of her gifts and talents, as she can lend them to other program areas.

#### WIGIAT? (Where is God in all this?)

We see this as a gracious gift that our youth will be able to hear God's word through this vibrant servant, who is answering her call. The Youth Team and Deacon Holland feel that Christine was led to this church and pray that the Spirit will continue to work through her as she embarks on this journey with our kids.

If you have questions or comments, please feel free to reach out to the Youth Team or a member of Congregational Council. Please continue to pray for our youth as we all know, it is tough out there for them. We are blessed they have St. Andrew's where they can come for God's peace and the support of a loving congregation.

### **Council Highlights**

#### **Opening**

Tom Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Paul Osmundson led the devotion. Council approved the minutes of the August 2019 meeting.

The Pastor's and Deacon's Reports were accepted as presented.

**Finance:** Giving for August 2019 was \$9,382 less than actual expenses and \$4,424 less than budgeted expenses. YTD giving through August 31 was \$9,330 less than actual expenses and \$8,839 less than budgeted expenses. Most over-budget expenses have been related to property/grounds maintenance, repairs, and purchases.

#### **Property**

Jay Folk reported that estimates for air conditioning unit replacements/repairs in the education wing, sanctuary, and kitchen are being reviewed.

Council has engaged The Boudreaux Group to develop design proposals for the narthex and adjacent areas. It is hoped that a presentation for the congregation will be ready by mid-November.

**Youth:** Susie Derrick reported that updates to the youth Sunday school room are almost complete. The Youth Team will be surveying youth and their parents and exploring ways to increase youth engagement in activities. In preparation for the 2021 ELCA youth gathering in Minnesota, the team is planning ways to encourage congregational giving to subsidize costs to families for this trip.

**Witness and Fellowship:** This team is considering various events to encourage relationship and community building, including collaborating with the Social Ministry Team in outreach activities. The Cattail Shelter at Saluda Shoals Park has been reserved for the annual fall outdoor worship service and picnic on Sunday, Sept. 22.

**Cemetery:** The Cemetery Team requested approval from Council to move forward with plans to correct drainage and erosion issues along the eastern side of the church cemetery. The team considered two estimates. A motion to approve the expenditure of \$6,600 to complete the repair work and related ancillary work was approved.

**Stewardship:** Plans are coming along for the October stewardship emphasis, including mailings and online information and the production of three videos to be shown during worship on three subsequent Sundays.

#### Education

The Education Team is working on plans to increase children's classroom space by moving the resource/storage room and doing some minor renovation work.

St. Andrew's, Ebenezer, and St. Paul's Lutheran churches are working together to schedule and coordinate confirmation classes for the coming year.

**Unfinished Business:** Council discussed the proposal to replace organ screening to better regulate airflow to pipes and to minimize undesirable temperature variations. Several screen designs are available. Council approved a motion to move forward with the replacement of organ screening, with assistance from the design team and/or The Boudreaux Group in choosing the precise materials to ensure proper aesthetics, with up to \$2,000 from undesignated memorial funds.

**2020 Ministry Plan:** Council reviewed the proposed 2020 Ministry Plan, including changes to team budgets. Adjustments approved by Council at this meeting will be incorporated into a revised ministry plan by the Finance Team. The approved 2020 Ministry Plan will be sent to council members once the Finance Team finalizes the changes. A motion to approve the 2020 Ministry Plan was approved.

**Closing:** Pastor Trump led prayers for parish concerns.
