

A Word from Pastor Trump

We just don't know. How wonderful if we did know what the immediate — let alone the long-range — future held for our church, our communities, for our nation, and for the world. I will share some thoughts about possibilities for the church. Our future is strong and vibrant. What it will look like is not clear. We do not know, as of this writing, when we will be able to gather in person for worship. When we do we may be forced to do so in smaller groups, practicing social distancing. We do not know when we will be able to have Bible study or Sunday school in person again. When those gatherings resume will we continue to offer some of the virtual opportunities? There is nothing good about a



virus that takes people's lives and has caused serious economic difficulties for many people. However, we still must ask ourselves what we can learn from this experience? How might we grow as a community? Have we found new ways to care for the weakest among us? Have we cared for one another as a community founded in God's sacrificial love is called to care? What is fascinating to me at least is the way that this has pushed forward some of the tools we were already encouraging. Automatic giving to the church has been a great source of support. We have been discussing for some time ways the church could use technology to further its' ministry. There have been questions about how we can use technology to connect people.

I am thankful to be the pastor with and for a community that longs to be one in Christ even as we are socially distant from one another. Please consider what opportunities God is putting before you at this time to help the ministry of this church. For instance, maybe there are those you know who would love to see our worship in the comfort of their home? Maybe there is someone who would join a virtual Bible study who otherwise would not attend? Maybe there is a neighbor who needs you to reach out to him or her in God's love, someone who does not have a church community? There are many and various ways we can serve at this time. Look for them.

Thank you for all the ways you have been serving and will continue to do so, no matter what the future may hold.

The church encourages electronic automatic giving. When you sign up for this it is a way of showing your trust and faithfulness to the ministry of Christ in this place. It is a way of making your thanksgiving through giving a priority. You can set your giving up electronically.

God is faithful and as Paul reminds us "nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Let us be faithful too. Maybe you can as well?

Council Highlights

Opening

- Jay Folk, vice chair, called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Council met via Zoom.
- Council approved the minutes of the March 12, 2020, Council meeting.

Pastor's Report and Deacon's Report

- The Pastor's report and Deacon's report were accepted as presented.
- Council approved a motion to postpone the summer Dramarama program for one year because of the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Deacon Holland announced that the SC Synod Assembly has been rescheduled for July 25, 2020.

Finance

- Giving for March was \$2,154 **more** than actual expenses and \$5,137 **less** than budgeted expenses.
- At the beginning of the month, the Finance Committee recommended that Council consider securing a loan through the federal Paycheck Protection Program of the Coronovirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act. On April 5, Council Chair Curtis Amick motioned that Council authorize the Finance Committee to apply for and secure a PPP loan on behalf of the church, with loan funds to be used to retain all existing staff at current compensation levels and to pay for other eligible expenses as outlined in the legislation, such that, following the eight-week utilization period, the loan will qualify for forgiveness under the provisions of the Act. By email vote, Council approved moving forward with the loan application. Pastor Trump announced at the April 16 meeting that the PPP loan request has been received.

Property Report

• Tom Bane reported that obtaining bids for HVAC work will prove difficult because the pandemic has put contractors and manufacturers at least eight weeks behind on responding to RFPs. He said he believes the best case scenario will be that we receive bids in June, with work not beginning until late summer/early fall. In the meantime, Justin Varco will attempt to obtain additional "opinions of probable cost" from contractors for budgeting purposes.

Education

 Georgia Godfrey reported that the Education Team has provided at-home Sunday school materials for children's classes.

Worship Committee

- Planning for recorded worship services continues without a specific end date. Council briefly commented
 on high viewership of the worship services posted on YouTube and the possibility that we are reaching
 many people who aren't in our community through video every week. Viewership during Holy Week was
 particularly high.
- Tom Bane shared a devotion and Pastor Trump adjourned with prayer concerns.
