Observe social distancing PLEASE. We know you are eager to see one another, but we have to behave ourselves.





Larry Nichols with *Lunch on Lawn* guided us to various areas in the city and we distributed food bags filled with cheeseburgers, salad, chips, fruit and dessert. Taking Care of God's Creation - Beth Trump

Last fall Ruth Lackstrom, Cathy Jordan and I attended a "Lutherans Restoring Creation" retreat at the Isle of Palms. There, we met Lutherans from all over the country whose congregations were actively engaged in environmentally friendly initiatives around their church campuses. We discussed many actions, large and small, that could be undertaken to take care for God's creation in a more proactive way. Take a look at their website: www.lutheransrestoringcreation.org.

Our recent Vision Statement included a goal to embrace stewardship of the environment by educating about and encouraging creation care. We'll soon assemble a leadership team to develop a plan for spearheading this effort, but I wanted to tell you about a couple of small initiatives we've already undertaken.

"Who Gives a [Poop]" is a company that makes a difference by selling toilet paper and donating millions of their profits toward building toilets and improving sanitation in the developing world. Check out their website - us.whogivesacrap.org. Small steps make a difference, so St. Andrew's will begin ordering paper products from them. Look for a chance to get \$10 off your first order in the next e-news.

Last year we experimented with coffee offered by a Lutheran World Relief program that partners directly with small-scale farmers from Nicaragua. Their model allows the farmers to expect a more stable, fair price for their product and continue to support their families by eliminating the middle man. 
Chase Paschal began classes in September in the Doctoral Program at the Presbyterian College School of Pharmacy.

This transitional home is for families who have made enough financial progress to not need to stay in host churches, but still need some assistance before they can completely graduate from the FP program. While in the transitional home, they will pay 30% of their income to get used to making these payments and living on a budget. When they secure more permanent housing, 100% of that money will be returned to them.



MINUTES

St. Andrew's Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting September 18, 2020

Opening

- Curtis Amick called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.; Council met via Zoom.
- Council approved the minutes of the August 2020 Council meeting.
- Council approved the agenda with the addition of updates on the HVAC system and on resuming in-person worship.
- Paul Osmundson shared a devotion.

President's Report

The President's Report was accepted as presented.

In response to the question about resuming in-person worship, Curtis Amick and Pastor Trump gave an update on the Covid-19 task force's decision-making process and its work to help ensure safety. The two medical professionals on the task force are monitoring infection rates and agreed to a plan to hold an outdoor, socially distanced worship service in the parking lot on Oct. 4. While DHEC continues to recommend that no more than 10 people gather together in an indoor room while safely distanced from one another, it does not limit the number of people gathered in an outdoor space. The task force believes that infection rates have decreased enough to gather outdoors without limiting attendance, as long as all people wear masks, space themselves apart, and follow other safety guidelines. Council discussed the advantages and the risks of gathering in larger numbers at this time. Communion services with fewer than 10 in the sanctuary will continue; larger gatherings will be scheduled at the discretion of the staff and Covid task force.

Pastor's Report and Deacon's Report

The Pastor's and Deacon's reports were accepted as presented.

Team Reports

Council received and accepted reports from the stewardship, education, worship, and social ministry teams.

Unfinished Business

Strategic Planning Team

The Strategic Planning team launched a video this week that asks members to envision the future of St. Andrew's and discern each member's part in that vision. The team prepared and mailed a detailed introduction to the vision plan the week prior to the video's launch. Both are posted on the website.

New Business

2021 Ministry Plan

Tom Henry introduced the proposed 2021 ministry plan on behalf of the finance team. Council reviewed all line items and discussed incorporating funding for the first year of Strategic Ministry Vision goal implementation. Pastor Trump said that this ministry plan is based on our work with the Synod program Stewardship for All Seasons which calls for a mindset of abundance, not scarcity, and will challenge members to lean in toward what we envision as the future of St. Andrew's. The ministry plan and strategic vision will be interdependent. Council members will continue to consider the budget proposal, and at its October 15 meeting will prepare a motion that will be presented for vote at the November congregational meeting.

Property

Tom Bane reported that the property team will arrange for the repair of the two HVAC units that serve the parlor and the sanctuary. These repairs will not exceed \$10,000.

Council approved a motion that the property team ask MDI Mechanical Design to solicit bids between now and the end of October for the replacement of the education wing/fellowship hall HVAC system (phase one) for presentation and recommendation at the November congregational meeting.

Pastor Trump reminded Council members to continue reading Mike Ward's book "Abundance," and he adjourned with prayer concerns.
