

Pajama Time with Church Friends

Did you know that every Tuesday night since March 24th the children of St. Andrew's have been gathering on Zoom for *Pajama Time with Church Friends*? In the early weeks, we were all learning how this Zoom thing would work and sometimes the link was wrong and there was a lot of user error on my part. The children didn't know how to act or what to say and some wouldn't say anything at all. But, as time passed (7 months/32 weeks) we have all learned a lot! I send out a reminder email on Tuesday afternoon asking the children to bring something specific to share. The week before Reformation, I asked them to wear something red or bring something red because we were talking about Martin Luther and the Reformation. We gather at 7:15. Many children come in their pajamas with wet hair from their evening baths. We welcome everyone and have a time of sharing about the theme for the day. Everyone gets a turn to show what they brought. Then we have a story, video or puppet show. Sometimes it's related to the weekly lessons from that Sunday, sometimes it is based on the church year and sometimes it's just what the Holy Spirit puts on our hearts for that week. After the lesson, Jenny Walrath (and sometimes Lynne and Christa LaSalle) will lead the group in a song. It's always an adventure!

Then, we end with prayer. Sometimes the children repeat a prayer after me but lately I've been asking the children for prayer requests. Tonight they had so many prayer requests that I had to cut them off! After the kids signed off, Jenny and I talked about what to do about the lengthy prayer time. We laughed about this "problem". How wonderful is it that these sweet children have so many prayers to speak to God that we run over our time? You in the congregation without little ones—on Tuesday nights at 7:15 would you please take a moment to thank God for these children for whom you made promises at their baptism? We are surely blessed to have a congregation who loves and cares for these little ones.

St. Andrew's Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting October 15, 2020

Opening

Curtis Amick called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.; Council met via Zoom.
Council approved the minutes of the September 17, 2020, meeting.
Council approved the agenda with the addition of a discussion on resuming in-person worship.
Erin Johnson shared a devotion.

President's Report

The President's Report was accepted as presented. In his report, Curtis Amick suggested that if weather cooperates, the November 8 congregational meeting could be held outside at 12:00 p.m. Council talked about ways to include more people – those who are more comfortable participating in activities online – so that everyone has the opportunity to vote on the 2021 ministry plan and Council nominations. There was a consensus to investigate the possibilities. Paul Osmundson agreed to gather a team to test available technology that would allow live observation and voting.

Pastor's Report and Deacon's Report

The Pastor's and Deacon's reports were accepted as presented.

Pastor Trump reported that the Church Re-opening Team continues to recommend that the church follow CDC guidelines still in place: that no more than 10 people gather together in an indoor room while safely distanced from one another. Council voted and agreed to a request for more conversation about plans for re-opening, to be discussed under New Business.

Team Reports

Council received and accepted reports from the worship, social ministry, and stewardship teams.

Stewardship Team: Tom Henry gave an update on this year's stewardship focus. Two temple talks are posted on the church's YouTube channel, and one more is forthcoming. All Council members confirmed their commitment to the campaign and their intention to participate by returning the "intent card" that will be mailed to every member toward the end of the month.

Unfinished Business

2021 Ministry Plan

Council approved a motion to amend the 2021 ministry plan proposed to Council at its September meeting by including Vision/Stewardship for All Seasons implementation in the stewardship cost center. Council approved a motion to present this final version to the congregation for approval on November 8.

New Business

Nominations

Council approved a motion to accept the recommendation of the Nominating Committee to present the following members to the congregation for approval as Council members with two-year terms beginning in January 2021: John Bass, Robbie Derrick, Mandy Glowacki, Georgia Godfrey (second term), Mary Lynn Fulmer, and Beth Hutchison.

Church Re-opening

Jay Folk requested time to discuss the discernment process for opening the church for indoor worship for more than 10 people at a time. Pastor Trump and Curtis Amick shared that the Church Re-Opening Team (which includes two physicians) meets weekly to review local statistics on the percentage of positive tests per number of tests administered. They noted that the team has researched and discussed other re-opening plans, specifically those adopted by the Virginia Synod of the ELCA and the Episcopal Church Upper Diocese, which follow CDC guidelines but also take the size of the room and the quality of air flow into consideration. Jay asked for confirmation that the decision to re-open will be one made by the full Council, and he requested that Council members receive regular information from the team on the statistics and government/ecclesial recommendations being considered as part of the discernment process.

Pastor Trump adjourned with prayer concerns.
