

A confession about donations to my church:

I didn't always return my pledge card. I had good intentions, but I would forget about it. There were times that I would find the pledge card in a stack of papers in January and assume it Share Your Stories was too late to submit it. So, I would throw away the pledge card.

I knew I would donate to the church regardless, so it didn't seem necessary.

What I didn't stop to consider is that SALC needed to know how much I, and the rest of the congregation, planned to donate in order to create a budget and determine ministry expenses. I also didn't realize that it was never too late to make a financial commitment to my church. I could have returned the pledge card, sent an email to Sharon Berger or pledged online once I realized my oversight.

My other confession is that my donations before I began giving online weren't always consistent. would forget my checkbook or miss church; thus, my donation wasn't made that week. When the church began promoting online options for giving, I knew that was my best avenue for following through on my good intentions. Now, I don't have to remember to write a check each week or month. More importantly, I am making contributions to support the ministry of my church on a regular basis.

I write this 'confession' in the hopes that if you relate to my story, you also realize the importance of letting the church know how much you intend to contribute to the church over the coming year. I also write this to share how online giving has helped me fulfill my responsibility as a Christian, to give back in a consistent manner.

COUNCIL MINUTES

St. Andrew's Lutheran Church Council meeting January 14, 2021 7:00PM

Opening

- Curtis Amick called the meeting to order; Council met via Zoom.
- Council approved the minutes of the Dec. 17, 2020, council meeting as written.
- Council approved the agenda.
- Paul Osmundson shared a devotion.

President's Report

Curtis discussed council assignments for 2021. Council members were assigned meetings to give devotions, with John Trump volunteering to handle devotions for the December 2021 meeting.

Curtis discussed the process for depositing the offerings made each Sunday. Previously, council members rotated handling those responsibilities. But with more church members submitting offerings online or by mail, the number of offerings given during worship services is shrinking. Curtis said a new process for depositing those offerings will be developed. Meanwhile, he will handle that responsibility in January and possibly a few Sundays in February.

Pastor's Report and Deacon's Report

The Pastor's Report and Deacon's Report were approved.

Sandra said the process for compiling the Lenten devotional books has started. This year, the devotions will be based on the Holden Evening Prayer service, with phrases from that service.

Team reports

Tom Henry said the stewardship team had discussed the end-of-year financials. The church made its budget, but was aided by a \$44,000 PPE loan. While it's now considered a loan, it will become a grant once all the paperwork is done.

Tom also talked about ideas for informing the Congregation about ongoing activities in the church. With the pandemic, many members may believe there's not a lot happening. That's not true. He suggested improving that understanding by asking individuals who are participating in activities to share their experiences. The stories could be just a few paragraphs.

The stewardship team also is discussing how to thank church members for their gifts and communicate how the money is being spent.

Unfinished business

Pastor Trump urged all teams to constantly focus on the church's new Vision Statement. Each team should ask how it can help the church achieve the goals and objectives.

New Business

For three years, the church has distributed its Christmas and Easter offerings to the Lutheran Campus Ministry at USC and the Love One Another Campaign. The campus ministry has received \$1,000 and the remainder went to Love One Another Campaign, for a total of \$5,756.

The Love One Another Campaign has ended.

Curtis motioned that this year, \$1,000 go to the Lutheran Campus Ministry at USC, up to \$1,000 to the Virginia Wingard United Methodist Church Food Campaign, and the remainder go to the church's current and benevolence account. Robbie Derrick seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Pastor Trump adjourned with prayer concerns.



We met Kim's family a couple of years ago through the Lutheran Family Services refugee program. She and her seven kids, with one on the way, came to the US from the Congo after having lived for several years in a refugee camp in Africa. The children, ages 15 to 2, attend Richland One schools. Kim has a job nearby and uses public transportation to get to and from work.

The family currently lives in a three bedroom apartment about down Broad River Road 2 miles from the church. She hopes to move to a house on February 20th and needs our help. We need you! We have one trailer available but could use another truck or two if you have that morning free. We also plan to provide them with a "new home starter kit" consisting of any items that a family needs when they move to a new house.

Some examples:

- Cleaning supplies (brushes, bucket, rubber gloves, dishwashing and clothes detergents, Windex/ Lysol, etc., vacuum cleaner, broom, mop, shelf liner, etc.)

- Paper towels
- Sponges
- Simple tools

The contractors have taken great care to protect our flooring with craft paper and poly.






