FROM PASTOR TRUMP

My marathon days are behind me (I think) so there have been few if any references to that 26.2 mile run or race of late. However, most of you know I have run a lot of them over the years. For the really good runners the marathon is often called a "20 mile run with a 6-mile race." The final 6 miles are the real test. Even for amateurs like me, the final 6 are the true struggle.

The time of Covid in our society and in our church has been a long, difficult run. However, we are now in the final stretch of the race. We are in the last 6 miles. The finish line is within sight as 50% of the population is vaccinated. All people above the age of 16 are eligible. During this final segment is when the strength and endurance and commitment of the community will be most tested.

The Covid Task Force is working hard to gather timely, scientific, unbiased information to help its decisions regarding recommendations for the community (see article). It is not always easy. I am also aware of the variety of faithful opinions and beliefs regarding our community's decisions about worship and gathering in person. Please know that I myself am torn about many of these questions. We have hung in there as a community for over a year. Surely we can make it a few more months (or less).

In the meantime, worship and ministry continue. Frankly, Covid is not an excuse anymore. Yes, I also dislike wearing a mask during worship. I want to hug people. Yes, I want to sing! Yes, I want to simply return to "normal."

Finally, thank you to all who are continuing to support the ministry of your church. To be honest, giving is not where it needs to be. The only thing I can conclude is that for some people being away from worship and fellowship has meant a drop in their contributions. I do not think many people in our church family have been affected financially by the virus. Actually, my guess is that most of us have seen our "net worth" increase over the past year as the market has done remarkably well. Is anxiety getting in the way of faithful giving?

As your pastor, I hope and pray that when this marathon is "over" rather than being worn out we will feel a sense of accomplishment, and that in time, the community will be stronger in faith than ever.

COVID TASK FORCE

The Covid Task Force met together with the Worship Team to discuss recent reports and opportunities moving forward.

You are welcome to talk with anyone on the task force. They include Pastor Trump, Deacon Holland, Jenny Walrath, Judy Venturella (Worship Team Chair), Curtis Amick (Congregational Council President), Dr. Claire Birdsong, and Dr. Donna Ray.

The critical data point is now recognized to be the number of cases in a county. This is measured in terms of cases per one hundred thousand. At one time the "positive test case" number was discussed but as people are being vaccinated fewer and fewer are being tested so this number is no longer helpful. As of this writing the case number for Richland and Lexington counties was hovering around 15 new cases per day per 100,000 people. The goal is to get it below 10 before further changes should be considered.

The Task Force relies on data from CDC and DHEC. An especially useful source to reference is CovidActnow.org.

The Task Force does consider that it believes our community has a high vaccination rate. This is based on the fact that 60% of people over the age of 60 in our counties are vaccinated, and on anecdotal evidence and casual "polling." We need to encourage vaccinations. Being vaccinated

does not eliminate the possibility of transmitting Covid but it is believed that it greatly reduces the possibility. Therefore, even if someone does not believe in the vaccine for themselves, they are encouraged to be vaccinated for the sake of their neighbor.

The Task Force and Worship Team discussed the possibility of having separate services for those who are vaccinated and those who are not but did not want to pursue this path.

Changes were made in our guidelines including increasing the number of people worshipping in the sanctuary to 50 and to allow singing (with masks) at the outdoor service.

CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL

Great News! The PPP funding in the amount of \$56,072.50 that St. Andrew's Lutheran Church qualified for in 2020 was forgiven, in its entirety on March 1, 2021. Thus, the church is not required to repay any portion of the initial loan. These were funds that helped St. Andrew's during 2020. Without these funds, St. Andrew's would have been approximately \$40,000 in the red at the end of last year.

Unfortunately, St. Andrew's does not qualify for a second round of PPP stimulus. So what does that mean? Simply stated, St. Andrews needs your monetary gifts now more than ever. At the end of our first quarter in 2021, (March 2021), our expenses were \$4,716.04 over our giving year to date, and giving was under our planned budget by \$37,574.83 year to date.

Many members of our St. Andrew's family have weathered the pandemic in good financial health. Have you received a stimulus check that you would consider gifting to the church? Many of our members view the worship service online. Has the lack of in-person attendance reduced your support to the church? Please consider using our on-line giving app our on webpage to continue your support or mail your check to the church.

We have so many blessings in our church family. The new HVAC system in the educational wing is now finished. We anticipate retiring our current debt in the fall. We have numerous ways to worship; online, in-person inside the sanctuary and our parking lot outside services.

Please consider how God has blessed you during this time and keep our church in your prayers.

MINUTES

St. Andrew's Lutheran Church Congregational Council meeting April 15, 2021 7:00 p.m.

- Curtis Amick called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.
- Mandy Glowacki led the devotions.
- Council approved the minutes of the March 18, 2021, meeting.
- Council approved the agenda as submitted.

President's Report

The job description for the youth ministry position has been updated and submitted to the Mutual Ministry Committee.

The Pastor's Report was submitted and accepted.

The Deacon's Report was submitted and accepted.

Committee Reports

Social Ministry: Beth Mullins noted that the social ministry team is working with Lutheran Services of the Carolinas to help support the Kasuku family from the Congo living in the Midlands. Members of Hope Church have provided support and a church home for Kasuku and several other families from the Congo.

Lutheran Services of the Carolinas offers mentors for families in its system. The mentors will help with homework, help around the family's house, and help ensure the families are not being taken advantage of. The mentors also help the family with budgeting.

COUNCIL MINUTES

Unfinished business

Church bus: The council discussed the status of the church bus. Robbie Derrick said he had driven the bus and inspected it. He said the bus is road-worthy, though it needs some TLC, including a cleaning. He said the bus will require maintenance, including an oil change, and the brakes need to be inspected.

Robbie said the bus can be driven around town, but it may not be suited for long trips.

After the council discussed how often the bus was used before the pandemic and who in the congregation used it, Paul Osmundson made a motion to explore the possibility of donating the bus to another church or organization. Beth Mullins agreed to reach out to Hope Church. Mandy Glowacki seconded the motion. The motion was approved on an 8-4 vote.

Pastor Trump noted that any decision to donate or sell the bus must be made by the congregation.

New business

Family Camp at Lutheridge: Beth Mullins made a motion for the church to provide up to \$150 per family to help pay the cost of attending Family Camp at Lutheridge. Mandy Glowacki seconded the motion. It passed on a voice vote with one objection.

Pastor Trump led the council in prayer for congregational members and others facing particular challenges or concerns.

The meeting adjourned at 8:43 p.m.




ACT OF KINDNESS




