St. Andrew's Lutheran Church is thankful for the generous and consistent giving of its congregation. It is this faithful giving that provides funding for the annual ministry plan. The 2024 Ministry Plan, approved on November 12, includes anticipated expenditures of just under \$540,000.

## Did You Know?

1. There are multiple ways that contributions can be made:
  - By cash or check dropped in the offering plates;
  - Electronically through the online donations website or mobile app;
  - Automatic e-checks set up through your financial institution.
2. When you give through the online website/mobile app, you have additional options:
  - Charge to credit/debit card;
  - Automatic withdrawal from your checking or savings account.
3. If you use your credit card to make a donation, you are given an option to increase your giving to cover the 2.75% service charge cost that otherwise is charged to the church.
  - The 2024 Ministry Plan anticipates that credit card charges paid by the church will exceed \$4,500.
  - If you elect to give through a direct withdrawal from a checking or savings account, the transaction cost is insignificant.

We appreciate any and all gifts, by whatever means they come to the church. The Finance Team just wanted you to be aware of the options available to you and how those choices affect the amount received by the church. Please consider utilizing one of the automatic withdrawal or e-check options (or opt to increase your credit card contribution to cover the processing fees).

Council President Berger called the council meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

Devotions: Whanna Bouknight

Beth Mullins made a motion to approve the minutes of the October Council meeting. Brian Teusink seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

#### **We Gather Capital Campaign Update:**

President Berger presented a financial update as of 10/31/23. Work is progressing in the sanctuary and bathrooms. The contractors uncovered asbestos in the bathroom, for which its removal will add approximately \$7,500 to the renovation cost and delay completion until mid to late January for the bathrooms.

**President's Report, Pastor's Report, Deacon's Report:** All accepted as presented.

## Old Business

**Strategic Vision/Goals:** The ongoing discussion of the Vision and Goals document was tabled until the Council retreat to be held in January 2024.

**Ratification of email vote:** Brian Teusink motioned to approve up to \$2,300 for new handbell tables for the sanctuary, to be paid from Worship Furnishings Fund. Anna Berger seconded the motion, which passed unanimously, having previously been approved via email.

**Staff job descriptions:** The Mutual Ministry Team updated staff position descriptions to reflect and clarify current duties, and presented to Council. Brian Teusink motioned to accept them as written, with Darrick Williams seconding the motion. It passed unanimously. Mutual Ministry also presented a Wage and Hour Statement for use upon the hiring of new staff members. Anna Berger motioned to accept the statement as written, with Whanna Bouknight seconding the motion. It passed unanimously.

## New Business

**Sound Booth:** Bert LaSalle presented schematics and costs associated with construction of a sound booth in the balcony. Such a space would centralize audio equipment and controls and make the space more efficient, safe, and aesthetically pleasing. Brian Teusink motioned that all costs as outlined (approximately \$5600.00) be rolled into the anticipated expenditures of the We Gather Campaign. Deb Varco seconded the motion; it passed unanimously.

**Council Retreat:** The 2024 Congregational Council will meet at the church on Friday evening, January 5 and Saturday January 6, 2024 for discussion and planning for the upcoming year.

**Newly Elected Council Members:** Pat Gagliano, Debra Outzs, and Jim Tener, elected at the annual Congregational Meeting on November 12, were invited to attend the December 14, 2023 Council meeting.

Pastor Trump led Council in prayer. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

At the last SC Synod Assembly I was honored to be elected onto Synod Council, a 21 member board charged with maintaining and supporting the synod's mission, vision and core values. We meet four times annually, two in person and two by zoom. Our first meeting was August 26.

The synod's mission is to develop church leaders to develop impactful faith communities and disciples of Christ. Its vision - what the world becomes because we live out our mission - is that every person in South Carolina experiences God's love and grace. Core values include living faith in Jesus as our cornerstone, fostering opportunities for partnership among leaders and communities of faith, and walking together in sacred trust as siblings in Christ.

As a congregation, we should insure that our own actions and words are geared toward living out these commissions.

Synod staff - Bishop Ginny along with Assistants Rick, James and Emily - are charged with insuring that Council and staff become more effective and impactful in their roles, growing rostered leaders in faith while equipping them with appropriate tools and connections, leadership training, and collaborating with congregations to develop new rostered and lay leaders. Council is responsible for ensuring that synod staff has the resources to live into these ministry areas.

One area the synod is concentrating on is identifying potential rostered leaders. As a congregation I ask that you prayerfully consider who in our St. Andrew's community may possess the spiritual and leadership gifts and could potentially fulfill a rostered leader role.

There are also lay leader development opportunities offered by the synod. One is a workshop entitled "2023 Ministry Toolbox". Here's the link:

**Did you know that St. Andrew's Lutheran Church is a collection sit for the Lutheran World Relief Ingathering?**

**What exactly is an Ingathering?** An Ingathering is a local collection of quilts and kits during which groups in the surrounding area combine all their completed quilts and kits onto a truck or box car that delivers them to one of LWR's warehouses. Typically, Ingatherings take place once each year, usually around the same time and in the same place.

**Where do the Quilts and Kits go?** LWR distributed its first quilts in 1945 to families in war-torn Europe following the Second World War. Within a decade, the ministry was reaching around the globe to villages far removed from the world's attention. Today, an average of 300,000 quilts are lovingly given worldwide each year.
