FINANCE

A Message From Church Council:

Church Council is recommending a 2024 Ministry Plan which includes a decrease in spending of slightly more than \$16,000 or 2.9%. The plan includes:

- An overall reduction in staff and contract labor expenses of approximately \$15,400, due to the elimination of videography services and reduction of nursery staffing
- An increase of 1% for all full-time and part-time staff, excluding nursery
- A decrease of \$2,500 in administrative expenses
- A 5.1% (\$1,500) increase in utility expenses and an 8.9% increase (\$4,700) in maintenance and insurance (mostly due to increased insurance expenses)

A copy of the summary recommended 2024 Ministry Plan follows.

This ministry plan was prepared considering current year giving levels as well as historic spending and giving. Copies of the full ministry plan are available by contacting the church's office manager. Members of church Council and/or the Finance Team will be available following the services on October 29 and November 5 to answer specific questions you may have.

A Congregational meeting has been called and will take place at 10:15 a.m. (in between the 8:30 and 10:30 services) on November 12, 2023. This draft 2024 Ministry Plan will be presented for a vote. Questions will be addressed during this meeting prior to the official vote.

COUNCIL MINUTES, October 12, 2023

Council President Berger called the council meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Devotions were led by Ingrid Driggers.

Darrick Williams made a motion to approve the minutes of the September Council meeting. Jill Areheart seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved.

We Gather Capital Campaign Update: Sanctuary work has begun, with worship services being held in the Fellowship Hall during renovation. The bathroom and parlor projects will be accomplished concurrently, with an anticipated completion date of November 28, 2023. The total amount we expect to receive by 12/31/24 is \$561,164 assuming no new gifts. The total estimated amount we expect to spend on all capital campaign projects is \$561,514. Council discussed the need to continue to ask members to give gifts to the campaign fund and any remaining money will be used for other building needs. The Capital Campaign Steering Team will share an update with the congregation in a letter and November newsletter.

President's Report, Pastor's Report: written reports were included in the agenda packet and accepted as information.

Deacon's Report: Deacon Holland's written report was included in the agenda packet. Deacon Holland told council members that there is rarely a child in the nursery during worship services due to parents keeping their children in service. She has spoken with nursery volunteers and parents about the need to continue to offer the nursery with a paid nursery assistant each Sunday. Deacon Holland and Pastor Trump have also spoken with our current nursery assistant about no longer offering a staffed nursery. With the exception of special services that are well attended, such as Christmas Eve and Easter, Council agreed with the recommendation to no longer have a paid nursery assistant.

Children's ministry, Social Ministry Team, and Fellowship Team: submitted written reports that were accepted as information.

Finance: A written report, with monthly financial statements, was submitted and included with the agenda packet. September offerings were improved from the previous month and exceeded the monthly requirement to support the current ministry plan. Mr. Teusink indicated giving exceeded expenditures by slightly more than \$7,400. However, year-to-date giving is still nearly \$29,000 below the ministry plan support requirement. At this same point last year, giving was nearly \$24,700 below actual expenditures and nearly \$23,400 below the 2022 Ministry Plan requirement.

Mr. Teusink presented the Finance Team's proposed 2024 Ministry Plan to the council, which was discussed and, with recommendations, was approved to be brought to the congregation for vote at the congregational meeting on November 12, 2023. The 2024 Ministry Plan includes a decrease in spending of slightly more than \$16,000, representing a 2.9% decrease from the 2023 Ministry Plan. Copies of the proposed Ministry Plan will be available to the voting members prior to the meeting.

Nominating Committee: The Nominating Committee presented the following slate of candidates to serve a two-year Council term beginning on January 1, 2024: Anna Berger, Jason Bradley, Pat Gagliano, Debra Ouzts Jim Tener, Brian Teusink, and Darrick Williams. Mr. Teusink made the motion to approve the slate of nominees and Darrick Williams seconded. The motion was approved unanimously. This slate will be presented to the congregation for a vote on November 12, 2023.

Strategic Vision/Goals: The ongoing discussion of the Vision and Goals document was tabled until next month.

Old Business

Mutual Ministry recommended that a "Wage and Hour" notice become part of employment records, with a sample form to be approved by Council. Brian Teusink motioned that it be accepted, Darrick Williams seconded, and the motion passed.

Council ratified the vote that occurred via email to approve a \$1,000 check to be paid for from the Building Use Fund to Khalil Harris for the damage that occurred from a tree on the church's property falling on his house.

New Business

Council decided to hold its retreat January 5-6, 2024. More details will be decided before the end of the year.


Pastor Trump led Council in prayer. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

We Gather Capital Campaign Update October 25, 2023

Work is progressing! These are exciting times.

Worship in the Fellowship Hall is proceeding while we look forward to getting back in the sanctuary by the end of November.

Updates:

As of 9/30/2023, we have \$358,744 in the capital campaign fund and we expect to receive an additional \$107,923 in remaining pledges by 12/31/2024. We have spent a total of \$94,496.74 on the kitchen renovation, the gathering area and sanctuary work completed so far. The total amount we expect to receive for the capital campaign by 12/31/2024, assuming no new donations, is \$561,163.74. Thank you for your faithful giving!

The cost of the kitchen renovation was \$80,731.38 and the parking lots are expected to cost \$ 115,000. This leaves a balance of \$365,432.36 for the narthex including the bathroom renovations, the sanctuary and the gathering area. The total expected cost for all of the capital campaign projects is \$561,514.38.

The painting is finished in the sanctuary and the carpet should be installed and pews back in place by 11/17/2023. The work in the narthex and parlor area should be complete by 11/28/23. The bathroom renovation project, which became necessary for permitting for the project, will begin before the carpet is installed in the narthex.


The current furniture in the parlor and current gathering area will not be put back in the space. The furniture for the new space is being ordered, and we will use folding chairs where needed until the furniture arrives.

You can see the changes happening already in the gathering area, narthex, parlor, and sanctuary. We will gather again in these spaces soon! We will continue to request donations for the We Gather Capital Campaign to have a larger cushion in case of unforeseen issues in the remaining narthex and sanctuary work. Church Council has discussed using any money left over for other building needs we have, so please consider continuing to support the Campaign as you are able.
