#### FROM PASTOR TRUMP

The news continues to not be so good. Afghanistan is a disaster and we do not know what will befall the people there. A recent report by 170 of the world's top climate scientists states that the environmental situation is worse than we thought and that without question humans are the primary cause of global warming. Covid is surging through our country. Our southern border has many issues including how are we to treat those fleeing to our country with justice and mercy even as we secure the border? The political world is as divided as ever. All these things I have mentioned share one thing: blame. Everyone wants to lay the blame for problems at the feet of someone else. We want simplistic answers to issues so that it is easier to pronounce blame. Humans like to point fingers at the other, which is why worship starts with confession.

We begin by admitting our own faults, our own most grievous faults. We ask how we have sinned in thought, word, and deed. We say with others that we have not loved as we have been loved.

Unfortunately, few of us will be able to have a large influence over the large issues facing our world. There may be ways we will be asked to do our part, maybe with conservation, or wearing a mask, or in taxes, or other ways. I certainly don't have all the answers. The Gospel does not give us all the answers to difficult problems as well, but it does direct us in how we are to approach problems. How can we love our neighbor as ourselves? How can we live for the sake of the other? It probably begins by not always blaming the other, be it the other party, the other race, or the other person across the street, or in the next pew!

# **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

# **AUGUST 2021**

- Approximately \$8000 has been pledged for the choir room fund which is enough for the floor and painting.
- The council agreed to accept the donation of a grand piano for the choir room from Ron and Jenny Walrath.
- The council voted to spend up to \$2,500 from the Memorial Fund to repair the church sign in front of the sanctuary.
- So far this year, giving is under expenses by about \$10,000. That includes money spent to remove several trees on the property. Were it not for the tree removal, giving and expense would be even.

Hurricane Ida made landfall near New Orleans on Aug. 29 – exactly 16 years after Hurricane Katrina. As a strong Category 4 storm, Hurricane Ida's 150 mph winds, torrential rain and strong storm surge caused widespread flooding and wind damage in southeastern Louisiana and coastal Mississippi. Homes are flooded and residents are awaiting rescue, which is hampered by the high waters and debris-clogged roads. Strong winds knocked out power lines and electrical substations, leaving more than 1 million people without power, including the entirety of New Orleans. In some areas, electricity is not expected to be restored for weeks. Ida weakened into a tropical storm as it moved inland and will likely cause heavy flooding in Mississippi, Alabama, and the Tennessee and Upper Ohio valleys.

The impact of Ida is yet to be fully assessed, but with a hurricane of this scale, rebuilding will be costly and take years. With extensive experience in accompanying communities throughout the relief and long -term recovery phases, Lutheran Disaster Response is working with local ELCA synods and Lutheran social service organizations to coordinate a response to Hurricane Ida. Immediate needs will include basic necessities and temporary housing. Long after the headlines change, Lutheran Disaster Response will continue to accompany communities on the journey of rebuilding their homes and lives.
