# PASTOR'S PAGE



Baptism.

Do we think enough about baptism? I do. These past few months have caused me to. We had baptisms in worship, including Reagan Gibbons and Jesse Cruse. Reagan laughed the whole time and Jesse slept! What was the same in these two moments of grace were that the parents of each child I know without a doubt will fulfill their promises. I also am confident that the church, including St. Andrew's, will work to do the same. We are responsible for providing the fertile soil in which these children will grow in God, learning of God's goodness and mercy, and knowing the love of Jesus in community and worship.

I also thought about baptism when I stood on two occasions before a young man (Tom Birdsong) and then before a young woman (Brittany Lucas) both of whom I baptized, and now I was asking them to say "I do" in a wedding ceremony. What joy, though it made me feel a little old! They too will fulfill their vows, of this I am sure.

However, I also thought about baptism when I had to perform the funeral service for someone I baptized a mere 18 years ago, Maliya (Clack) Scott, Mariko's daughter, tragically killed in auto accident. At that service I spoke of the Easter Vigil where we poured water on her head in the name of the Father. and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, proclaiming her God's child. Mariko and her family fulfilled their vows, faithfully bringing her to God's house. The good news is that God still fulfills God's promises to Maliyah and to us. We are offered comfort and grace in the midst of incredible pain and sadness. This community must be servants and ministers of the comfort and mercy of God to all in need. That is part of our promises we must keep. There are a lot of things in this newsletter, many of which may strike you as just "church business." I encourage you to see everything in light of baptism. How does a stove help us cook a meal where people of God gather? How do your gifts enable us to provide worship? A church staff? How does Bible study fulfill our promise in baptism to teach God's word? Everything, but everything we do in the church, we must do because we are baptized and because we seek to fulfill our promises.

In fact, I challenge you to see everything you do each and every day, in all aspects of your life, in the same glow of your baptismal candle. "So let your light shine before others, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father in heaven."

#### **GET READY TO COOK!**

**Refrigerator:** The "old refrigerator" went out. Thanks to Memorial Funds we were able to pay for a new one at the cost of \$4100. THANK YOU!

**Stove:** The present stove has troubles. When we leave the gas on the pilot lights go out and then there are leaks. So, to be safe we turn off the gas. musicians, and better reflects the vital role that music ministry plays in our worship life at St. Andrew's.


Stop by and see our new space! And, while you're at it, please thank one of our volunteer musicians, who have worked hard to continue to bring music to our worship during the past 18 months.

**NO DEBT!!:** As of December 1<sup>st</sup>, we will no longer be in debt. St. Andrew's has had a debt for at least 60 years, for one reason or another. There was the actual building, then all the flat roofs, then the windows—the list can be endless. There may be reason in the future that we must do so again. We cannot say for certain. However, the hope and prayer is that all those who have faithfully paid off this debt with about \$3000 per month will redirect those regular gifts to Current and Benevolence or another fund of their choosing. Right now, let us celebrate the faithful stewardship of this community.

# STEWARDSHIP NEWS

You will be receiving your annual Stewardship Appeal in the mail very soon. PLEASE take the time to read and respond. Some of the highlights are:

- We give to support the ongoing ministry of God in and through your church. The question is: Do you see the value of what God is doing? Do you see how God feeds you at the table prepared here?
- The goal for 2022 and the MINISTRY PLAN for 2022 will be closely aligned. We are asking you to give what we honestly expect to spend. The Ministry Plan for 2022 will be less than in 2021.
- The goal is always to have 100% return of "Estimate of Giving Cards." Those who do so are more likely to fulfill their own goals.
- You are being asked to honestly examine your giving. There are plenty of those in the congregation who give just as they can. There are others who maybe have not truly looked at their giving as compared to their resources and income.
- There is real excitement as we expect to come out of the pandemic. This year we were able to spend less because quite frankly we had less activity due to Covid. We hope that there will be more gatherings, more meals, more outreach as we can gather as together and serve as a community.
- **AUTOMATIC GIVING** works. When you schedule a regular gift to your church from your bank you are making this gift a priority. It is secure and easy and can be changed with a phone call. Contact the church for more information or speak with your financial institution.

# **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

- Congregational Council met on September 16, 2021.
- Reviewed the proposed ministry plan for 2022. Council members asked the finance team to make a few adjustments. The council is scheduled to approve the plan at its October meeting.
- Asked the gift task force to consider and recommend to the council whether to accept a donor's offer to purchase a new stove for the kitchen.
- Considered changes to the church constitution. The potential changes will be reviewed by the S.C. Synod office. The council is scheduled to vote on the changes in October.
- Agreed to pay for a new refrigerator with money from the building use fund rather than the property team's budget.
- Received reports from Pastor, Deacon, and several Teams.

# MAKUSI WATER MISSION PROJECT

Rev. Trump,

We're so thankful for you and all of our friends at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church. I've messaged with our team in Tanzania, there have been some challenges this year, but water continues to flow. I've asked our Tanzania Project Manager for a more full update and will send it to you when I hear back. A few victories to share in the meantime. I pray that this encourages all of you!

- Initially, you all supported the Magoye project but shifted to a community call Makusi.
- Makusi is serving an estimated 1,615 people with safe water on a daily basis.
- Since its initiation in March 2019, Makusi has produced 43,321,432 liters of safe water.
- The Makusi Safe Water project is producing around 50,000 liters on a daily basis.
- I've attached a few pictures of water flowing and some recent meetings with the leadership in the community.


