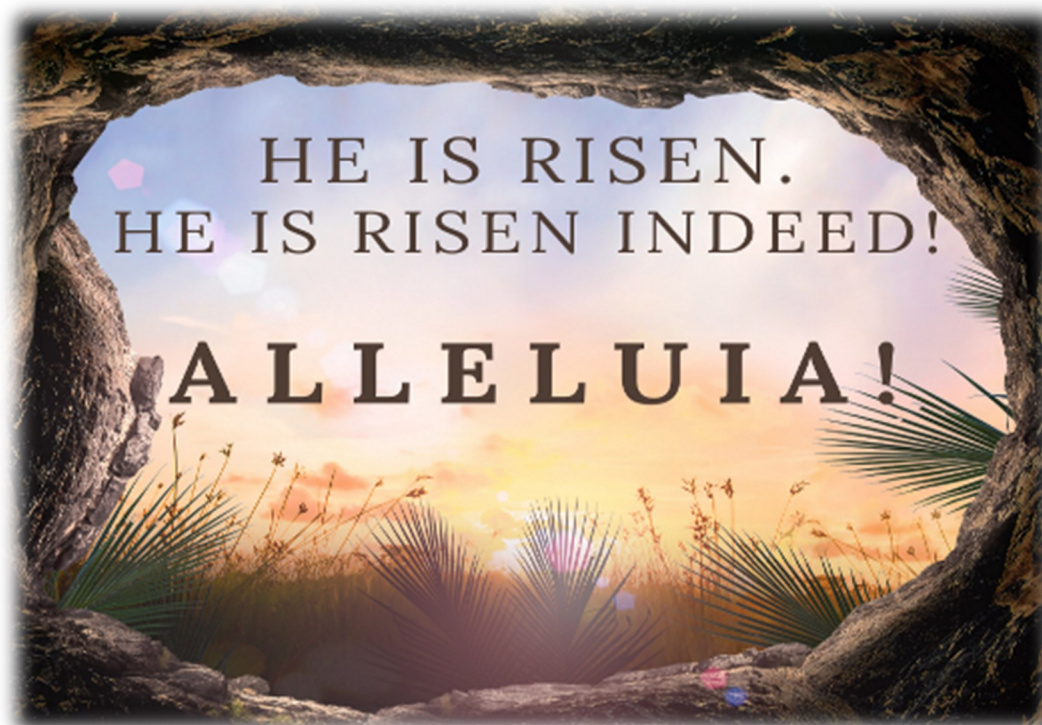

“Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.” (Romans 6)

There was the death of Charles Dawkins, and the memorial service that followed. What a wonderful friend and faithful part of this community. He served the church over his 91 years so faithfully, in so many ways, and at the end of his years we were blessed to benefit from his presence. We were also blessed to have the chance to be therewith him and his family at the end. By being present we were fulfilling baptismal promises made to Charles, yes, as a baby. YOU were doing so, as part of this community, even if you were not there. What one does, all do. Finally, on the same day we remembered Charles, we also worked together in INASMUCH, doing something that was near and dear to Pastor Dawkins: reaching out to those whom Christ calls us to serve. Loving as God has loved us. Serving refugees and those in adult “facilities” and more. So thank you. As your pastor, I am blessed, to serve with you. To be baptized, in the same waters of grace.

WOMEN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS – IT'S TIME TO GET BUSY!

Y'all know Easter didn't end after Resurrection Sunday, right? The stores may say it's over, but we can't just celebrate this victory and then quietly tuck the good news away with our Easter bonnets. After the Resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples and told them to ACT! It was now their responsibility to take the Gospel to the world and ACT on His behalf.

The yet-to-be-named-so-currently-known-as Women's Sunday School class had meaningful discussions about the nature and mystery of Jesus, as told through John. We went beyond the originally planned 6 weeks, but the extension allowed for better conversations and, importantly, relationship building. The teachers Beth, Beth, and James Ann are ready to continue with a study of Acts. The format will be like the John study with videos and discussion, while using the study guide *Acts: Catching up With the Spirit* by Matthew Skinner. We will begin this Sunday (April 24) with a general introduction to the Acts of the Apostles and begin the book study the following Sunday (May 1). It is not necessary for the class, but if anyone would like to have a copy of the book, it may be purchased from several online outlets, such as Amazon and Barnes & Noble. Please join us as we continue the narrative begun in the gospels. Jesus tried his best to get the message through to his followers so that they could continue His work. Did they listen? Who rises up to meet the challenge? What happens to that close band of brothers (and sisters)? What the heck happened in the Upper Room?

Acts is thought to have been written by the author of Luke, as both are addressed to "Theophilus." The identity of this person is not known, but as it meant "friend of God" or "Beloved of God" we can all assume that it was written directly to us, His church. Come! Learn! Act!

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

APRIL MEETING

Devotions were shared by Anna Berger. Minutes were approved. The Finance report was accepted.

Pastor's, Deacon's, and Intern's reports were all received.

Reports were presented by each of the three teams for the "Gathering in Grace" capital campaign that is under consideration. The three are the parking lots, the kitchen, and the sanctuary/narthex/gathering area. Tom Henry presented for the parking lot stating that they receive two similar bids. The Kitchen team, headed by Sybil Long, is requesting the approval for an overhaul of the kitchen including a new stove/oven. They are still looking at bids and discussing alternative sources. The "sanctuary/narthex/gathering area" team presented the plans Boudreaux architects developed. They were well received though there were some questions about the choice of carpet for the narthex. Final numbers will be presented next month.

Property Team presented that there will be extensive work done outside along Broad River Road and Elm Abode, taking out overgrown shrubbery and bushes. The Property Team also needs to purchase a riding mower and other equipment.

The Welcome House needs a new panel box, with the approximate cost of \$2000. The repair was approved to come from the Welcome House Fund.

The Council decide to not fill Mandy Glowacki's empty seat currently, since elections are relatively close.

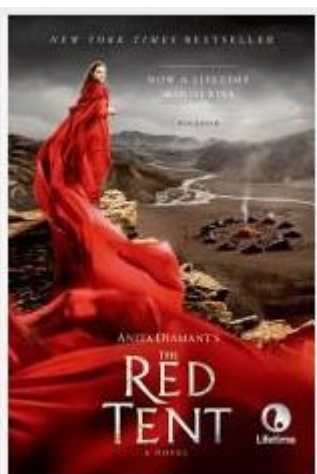
Council closed in prayer.

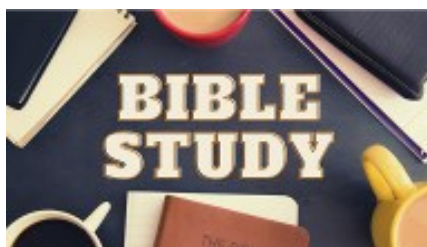
