PASTOR'S PAGE

FROM PT:

I confess. I love to teach. I was reminded of this during our first “class” for the adults at VBS. We had a good diverse group, older, younger, long-time members, newer folks. The topic was the seven-day creation story from the first chapter of Genesis. Now, I have taught and discussed these passages many times before, yet once again we experienced something new as we shared. People had new insights, new “feelings” about what they heard. The Word of God is a living word. It comes to us fresh and new each time we consider it. We do so in worship and preaching, discussions with each other, and when we read the Bible on our own. It is unfortunate that often, I think, there are those who come on very strong about their supposed “expertise” in scripture. They yell the loudest and speak about what they clearly know to be the one truth. They want to “lock down” a meaning. Yet, when you encounter God’s word, when you read stories about Jesus debating God’s word, it seems the last thing that is done is that it is “locked down”. God’s word is active. The Holy Spirit is alive in the Word. The Word, the living Word of God, is a gift of grace and goodness to all the world. I hope you take time to engage in God’s word in whatever way you can. And yes, if you feel so moved, this fall, join a Bible study or Sunday school class. Like I said: I love to teach, because in doing so, I learn.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

August 18, 2022 Church Council meeting in the SALC conference room.

Anna Berger called the council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Minutes were approved. Devotions were led by Pastor Trump.

Capital Campaign Update: Ron Walrath gave a report about the fundraising strategy for the Capital Campaign and passed out the first copy of the information brochure for the campaign. Council members asked several questions about the specifics of the fundraising efforts.

President's Report: Anna Berger submitted a written report prior to the meeting. There were no questions or discussion.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Trump submitted a written report prior to the meeting. There were no questions or discussion.

Deacon's Report: Sandra Holland submitted a written report prior to the meeting. Pastor Trump and others thanked her for an outstanding Vacation Bible School. Deacon Holland mentioned that she and Beth Hutchison are working with EE Taylor Elementary School to reestablish the Snack Pack program this year. It was discontinued for the past two years due to the interruptions of attendance caused by Covid 19. Once details and logistics are worked out with EE Taylor, SALC will resume the snack pack program.

Children's ministry: Ingrid Driggers submitted a written report prior to the meeting. Ms. Driggers and Deacon Holland announced activities planned for the different age groups over the next month. Deacon Holland reported that she is still gathering information about the number of children who are expected to attend Sunday School, which started on Aug. 21.

Finance report: Brian Teusink submitted a written report prior to the meeting. He reported on the finance committee meeting that was held on Monday, August 15. The finance committee discussed the 2023 Ministry Plan and will bring a first draft to Council in September. (continued on the following page)

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED

Mr. Teusink announced that the Finance Committee made a motion that the church use Neil Brown, CPA, CFA, Financial Consultant with Burkett Financial Services in West Columbia to help SALC establish a brokerage account. Pastor Trump amended the motion and Darrick Williams seconded the amendment to assign management of the brokerage account to the Council President, Chair of the Finance Committee and the Church Treasurer. The motion and amendment passed unanimously.

The finance committee met with the Treasurer to address the monthly statements. They decided on a new system of recording donations that will clarify when donations are made. The Council unanimously affirmed the recommendation.

Mutual Ministry: Anna Berger submitted a written report prior to the meeting. She presented a plan to increase Nancy Gibbons' responsibilities by taking over the Musical Ensemble which would require an additional 10 hours per month. It was also suggested that Paige Gibbons work an additional 10 hours per month to direct the elementary children's choir. The additional responsibilities for these two staff members will cost approximately \$2,000 extra between September and December, 2022. No motion was needed by Council members. However, Council gave a consensus to approve the additional duties and the added expense over the next four months. Mutual ministry will meet next week to see what impact this will have for the 2023 ministry plan.

Social Ministry: Beth Hutchison submitted a written report prior to the meeting. She asked Council members to consider volunteering for the Sept. 10 event where SALC is providing a hot meal to the homeless population at the Christ Central facility on Main Street in Columbia.

Old Business

Pastor Trump mentioned that a survey was sent to the people who use the online services offered by SALC. He reported that approximately 25 people regularly watch the online service and gave a variety of reasons why they prefer this service. The Worship Team is considering what type of online services should be offered. Mr. Teusink mentioned that the Ministry Plan currently budgets \$9,000 for videography.

New Business

Sandra Holland brought up the Team Meetings. Due to Covid, the regular team meetings were eliminated. Council discussed the with Deacon Holland and Pastor Trump the advantages of resuming team meetings quarterly. Deacon Sandra was asked to develop a schedule for team meetings for the upcoming year. Council also discussed the need to recruit new team members by explaining to church members the mission of each team.

Pastor Trump was approached by an organization that places recycling bins in easily accessible parking lots about placing one of their recycling containers in the church parking lot and paying the church \$400/month for the space. Council discussed the offer and decided it was not a good idea at this time.

It was reported that a leaf blower and an edger were stolen from the garage while the lawn was being mowed. Also, efforts are being made to address the potholes in the parking lot.

Brian Teusink made the motion to approve spending \$11,000 for furnishings in the conference room using the \$10,000 that was received from a memorial gift to pay for the furnishings. Darrick Williams made the second. The Council unanimously approved the motion.

Council closed in prayer led by Pastor Trump.

FIREFLIES VOUCHERS

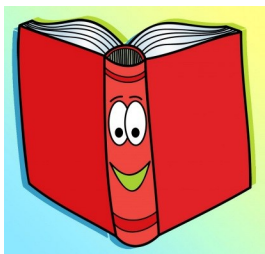
