

Anything you can do is appreciated.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

October 13, 2022

Devotions were led by Ingrid Driggers. Minutes were approved.

Anna Berger offered a WE GATHER CAMPAIGN update with a reminder of the council duties for the banquet on October 30th. Robbie Derrick asked when the construction for the campaign projects would begin. Council discussed the cash flow options for the campaign and decided to table the discussion until the October or November Council meeting when more pledge information would be available.

Reports were received from the President, Pastor, and Deacon.

Pastor Trump explained to the council the origins and purpose of the Woolly/St. Andrew's scholarship at Southern Seminary. He also reported on our new seminarian, Dr. Lillian Okoronkwo.

Deacon Holland reported the very positive response to the upcoming Women's Retreat, and the ongoing "St. A's Play Day".

Children's Ministry: Reported that it is working on the need to renew background checks for anyone working with children and youth. Upcoming events include Trunk or Treat on Oct. 23 and the church lunch on Oct. 30. November 27 is Advent Day with crafts and maybe a food truck again. In December, we may go caroling and to the Lights at the Zoo. Many of these events are church wide or for both Little Lutherans and Luther League. We would also like to plan some activities just for the Luther League kids later in the school year.

Social Ministry: The Social Ministry Team offered a detailed report on its activities and how it distributes the funds the congregation allocates to go to local ministries.

Finance: The final ministry plan was approved (see article in this newsletter).

There was a vote to ratify the purchase of a musical keyboard, as recommended by the Director of Music, for up to \$1,100 drawn from the Undesignated Memorial Fund.

The slate of nominees for church council (see article in this newsletter)

Options for a council retreat in January were discussed.

Property: Robbie Derrick submitted a written report prior to the meeting. He stated several members and staff had asked about adding security cameras to the outside of the church. Fire suppression and evacuation plans for the church were also discussed. Mr. Derrick stated that Tom Henry had offered to help with the evacuation plans. Mr. Derrick will contact the security alarm company to discuss options and bring back to council. He will also ask Mr. Henry to work on the evacuation plans.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED

Social Ministry: Deacon Holland provided an update on the backpack program. She stated that Harvest Hope would provide prepackaged food packs and would deliver them to E.E. Taylor Elementary School on our church's behalf. Youth: Georgia Godfrey submitted a written report prior to the meeting. There were no questions or discussion. Deacon Holland shared the children and youth roster.

Deacon Holland shared that we had two new families—the Cannon family and the Buckles family—that would like to join the church. Anna Berger made a motion to approve the Cannon and Buckles families as new members. Darrick Williams seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Pastor Trump asked for prayer concerns and led the council in prayer.

After hearing requests from across the church for guidance, the ELCA Church Council in November 2021 authorized development of a social message on climate care. Social messages are ELCA social teaching documents on specific social topics; these documents shape ELCA policy and help members discern how to respond to an issue.

A draft of the social message "Earth's Climate Crisis" is now posted for public comment! Feedback of this kind helps the drafters know how the document could be more clear, helpful and faithfully Lutheran. Worship Team - This team plans all worship services and worship-related activities.

Fellowship Team - This team is responsible for meals and fellowship events like the church picnic, food trucks, ect.

Youth Team - This team works in conjunction with Paige Gibbons and Deacon Sandra to support and help make decisions about the 6th-12th grade youth program.

Children's Ministry Team - This team works in conjunction with Deacon Sandra to provide programing for the 5th grade and younger and their families (Luther League and Little Lutherans.)

Education Team - This team plans out the Sunday School curriculum for the children for the year and also oversees Vacation Bible School.

Stewardship Team - This team works with Pastor Trump to develop a stewardship strategy for the church each year.

Property Team - This team oversees the outside property and inside property of the church.

Social Ministry Team - This team makes decisions about what Social Service agencies will be supported each year through our ministry plan and also plans and implements service projects for the congregation to serve in the community.

Finance Team - This team oversees the church Ministry Plan and helps with budgeting purposes.

Cemetery Team - This team oversees the upkeep of the cemetery which is located on St. Andrew's Road and is available to help mark graves and answer questions about burial.

Communication Team - This team oversees the website and social media outlets for the church in conjunction with the Office Administrator and Deacon.

Mutual Ministry Team - This team serves much like a personnel committee but in addition to discussing salaries and job descriptions, the people on the team serve as a support system for the staff with each person on the team being assigned to one staff member.

WHERE HAVE THE CHOIR ROBES BEEN?

You may have noticed that our choir has not been robing as often as in the past. When the choir returned to singing after the worst of the Covid pandemic, our choir room was in the middle of a rehab and the robe closet was not accessible, so we returned to the loft in 'street clothes.'

Choir robes are meant to present uniformity in order to focus more on worship. However, to some, choir robes may present a barrier to worship and give the impression that the choir is 'more than' the congregation, while in fact the choir is a leadership extension of the worshipers in the pews. There are good points on both sides.

Our Worship Team has had good conversations about choir robing, and has decided that going forward, the choir will robe intentionally based on the liturgical year, and on festival Sundays, as follows:

Reformation Sunday

All Saints Sunday

Christ the King Sunday through Easter

Pentecost Sunday

This practice will serve to highlight the solemnity and/or celebration of festival Sundays, while also underscoring the role of the choir as lay members who also serve to lead.


CARE PACKAGES FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS
