

PASTOR'S PAGE



Another year has passed. For those who are confused and think I am jumping the gun, the reality is that in the church ADVENT marks the beginning of a new church year. This makes me pause to reflect on the past year here at St. Andrew's.

First, it was a year of not being controlled by Covid. We worshipped and ate and gathered together. There is still a virus out there, and we must still show caution and care, but we can be a community in person again.

During this year we have seen the full integration of our new choir director and Youth Associate Paige Gibbons added elementary music to her plate. While we may find the children simply "cute" up front, let us never forget that such programs as this are ways we seek to fulfill baptismal promises. We promise to teach them the ways of Christ, to bring them to worship, to

help them know and love God. These seeds are planted early.

The major event and program of the year was undoubtedly the WE GATHER CAMPAIGN to address the narthex, kitchen, gathering area, and parking lot. Our goal was to have gifts or pledges of \$500,000. I have never been a part of such a campaign. I have to say a word of thanks to Pastor John Wertz who told us: "You can do this. This church can do this." He had had a lot of experience in his ministries with such campaigns. And he was right! As of this writing we are at approximately \$430,000. The council will be looking at how we will move forward with the projects. While "construction" is not my favorite thing, the further ministries that these projects will enhance are! Excitement is contagious.

Well, while I am mentioning money, I want to say thank you for your generous support this past year to our ministry plan. You will hear more in January, as due to the We Gather Campaign we have delayed our stewardship effort. We did have some unexpected expenses mostly with property. The church still spent less than budgeted, however, we are unfortunately as of this writing in the "red" for the year. If we don't catch up in December it will come out of savings.

This year we also saw an increase in the number of refugees in our Refugee Welcome House. In some ways, we need to pray for the day when there are none, but right now there have been many Afghanistan families in the home. This is a critical ministry that connects us to God's wider world.

We have also had an ongoing "issue" with our resident homeless on the property. What do we do? How do we show compassion, but still care for the property and have a place where children can play?

Our relationship with Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary remains vital and strong. The second half of the year saw the completion of Stephen Abbott's internship with us. He was a real blessing and joy. Now, we have our "field education student" Dr. Lilly Okoronkwo. She is learning about the Lutheran church, with a focus right now on worship. If you haven't talked with her you are missing out! We will be sad to see Dr. Mary Shore and Hank Shore move away this next year, as her time as Dean of the Seminary is ending.

This year the Rev. Leroy Cannon and his wife Helen joined our church. I mention him because he serves on the council for the ELCA, our national church. We can have some firsthand information about how the church works and the problems and joys we share.

This year we have of course a new congregational council. I have made jokes about the fact that it is overwhelmingly female! Yet, think about it. For how many years were women not even considered for council? I remember the first female president of council. THANKFULLY leadership in the church is wider and more diverse than it once was. Think of all the talent and gifts the church "left on the table" by ignoring women, people of color and other ethnicities and more. This church is blessed with excellent volunteer leadership. This next year will be exciting. In the midst of all the projects and such, let us hold onto what it central, namely our community in Christ. Let us put care before construction, ministry before money, and labor in love of God and neighbor.

A Capital Funds Campaign for St. Andrew's Lutheran Church

November 15, 2022

Dear Fellow Congregants of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church:

We have gathered, and we have gathered well. Thank you for your faithfulness expressed in your support of the WE GATHER Capital Campaign.

Where We Are:

To date, we have on hand \$246,445, which combines the \$91,262 transferred from the Narthex Fund started before COVID, plus the \$155, 183 in campaign pledges already received. By the end of the two-year campaign, we expect to have received a total of \$446, 157 (the \$246, 445 on hand now + the \$199,712 in additional pledges).

Most impressively, ninety-four giving units/ individual members have pledged!!

Where We Are Going:

The steering team is meeting and planning. We are gathering information on when the different projects could start and timelines for the work. We will be making decisions based on this data and the money on hand. This will be an ongoing process over the next two years as we receive additional funds, and as work schedules develop. We hope to start in the next couple of months, if possible, but this will depend on project management in the context of ongoing worship schedules.

What to Expect:

We will communicate updates with monthly Mission Moments and newsletter up dates. Before we spend any money, with the guidance of the project teams and congregation council, we will bring this before you, the congregation, for approval on each part of the project. We are thankful for our ongoing teams working together to make the best decisions as we feel the forward momentum and excitement of things to come.

What to Do:

Continue to pray for the leadership of our church and wisdom to use our resources in a way pleasing to God as we work to further our space for continued fellowship in His Word. Continue to work toward meeting your pledge. Continue to read the updates.

Most importantly, thank you.

Thank you for your support.

Thank you for your faithfulness.

Thank you for your prayers.

What do these numbers mean?

- Your church has spent LESS than was budgeted.
- We have spent MORE than was donated.
- There were several large expenses this year, mostly due to property, that have contributed to our "debt."
- Any debt that we have at years end comes out of our savings. Those savings were cut in half when we had to repair the HVAC system. Presently we have *approximately* \$120,000 in "undesignated" funds. There are other savings in such places as the "Cemetery Fund," "Pastor's Discretionary Fund".... etc. These funds are designated for a specific purpose and may be used with permission of the Council, or the Congregation, or in the case of the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, the pastor.
- We can pay for deficits such as this for one more year. After that, harder questions about expenses would have to be considered.

Unfortunately, the vast majority of our annual budget have become "fixed costs." We try to reduce the energy bill, or office maintenance, or other such things but they can only go so low. Salaries are within guidelines. Our Synod giving is at 10%. There is very little fluff left in the budgeted Ministry Plan.

Maybe you are a little behind in your giving for the year?

Maybe you are someone who can give a little extra to your church to help close this gap?

Thank you again, for all your faithful stewardship and the ministry that has happened.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Council Highlights, Thursday, November 17th

- 1. John Bass offered devotions. Minutes from the October meeting and the November congregational meeting were approved.
- 2. Anna Berger gave a WE GATHER CAMPAIGN update with financial numbers plus a reminder of all that there is to do. A group will be meeting to write thank you notes.
- 3. The Pastor's and Deacon's reports were accepted.
- 4. A substantial discussion was had regarding the homeless situation around the church. Fencing in the pack "porch" at the end of the single-story wing was considered, as were other ideas. In the end the council agreed that putting up fencing was not what we wanted to do and not the message we want to communicate to the neighborhood. Pastor Trump will continue contacting the city regarding resources.
- 5. The Finance Team gave their report. Giving was flat in October despite a 5 Sunday month. Non-dedicated funds (our "savings") are down to \$110,000. The council agreed with a Finance Team recommendation that beginning this December, our Synod benevolence will be "adjusted" at the end of each year so that we tithe based upon actual giving rather than what we have budgeted. This applies in years of deficit and in years of excess.
- 6. Social Ministry reported that they are still working with schools regarding the "backpack" program.
- 7. The Communication Team is working on a new platform for the website.
- 8. The Property Team reported that there will be some outside cleaning up done by a professional crew.
- 9. A request by Karen Baptist Church (the group that uses our facility each Sunday afternoon) to meet on Christmas Eve in the Fellowship Hall at 6:00 PM was approved.
- 10. The council discussed having its January retreat on the weekend of the 27th/28th at the Derrick residence on Lake Hartwell.

The meeting adjourned with prayer concerns.


COME ONE, COME ALL!


Lutheran Men meet the 2nd Tuesday of each month. They will not meet in December, but will resume on January 10.
